

The Story of Creation in Seven Days (Genesis 1)

The seven-day creation story (Gen 1:1 to Gen 2:4a) has its own architecture. A study of the narrative structure reveals even more meaning.



Separates light/darkness




Separated sky and sea







Ancient Cosmology

The Israelites modelled their creation story on the creation sequence in the Babylonian story *Enuma Elish*, to which they were exposed during the Exile (6th century BC). They believed that the earth was supported by pillars and that it was under a solid canopy of heaven, above which there was water. God controlled the 'sluices of heaven' to send rain.
