- Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine, Baltimore, Maryland (Presidential Proclamation).
- Flag House Square, Albemarle and Pratt Streets, Baltimore Maryland (Public Law).
- United States Marine Corp Memorial (Iwo Jima), Arlington, Virginia (Presidential Proclamation).
- On the Green of the Town of Lexington, Massachusetts (Public Law).
- The White House, Washington, DC. (Presidential Proclamation).
- Washington Monument, Washington, DC., (Presidential Proclamation)- Fifty flags are displayed here.
- United States Customs Ports of Entry which are continually open (Presidential Proclamation).
- Grounds of the National Memorial Arch in Valley Forge State Park, Valley Forge, Pennsylvania (Public Law).

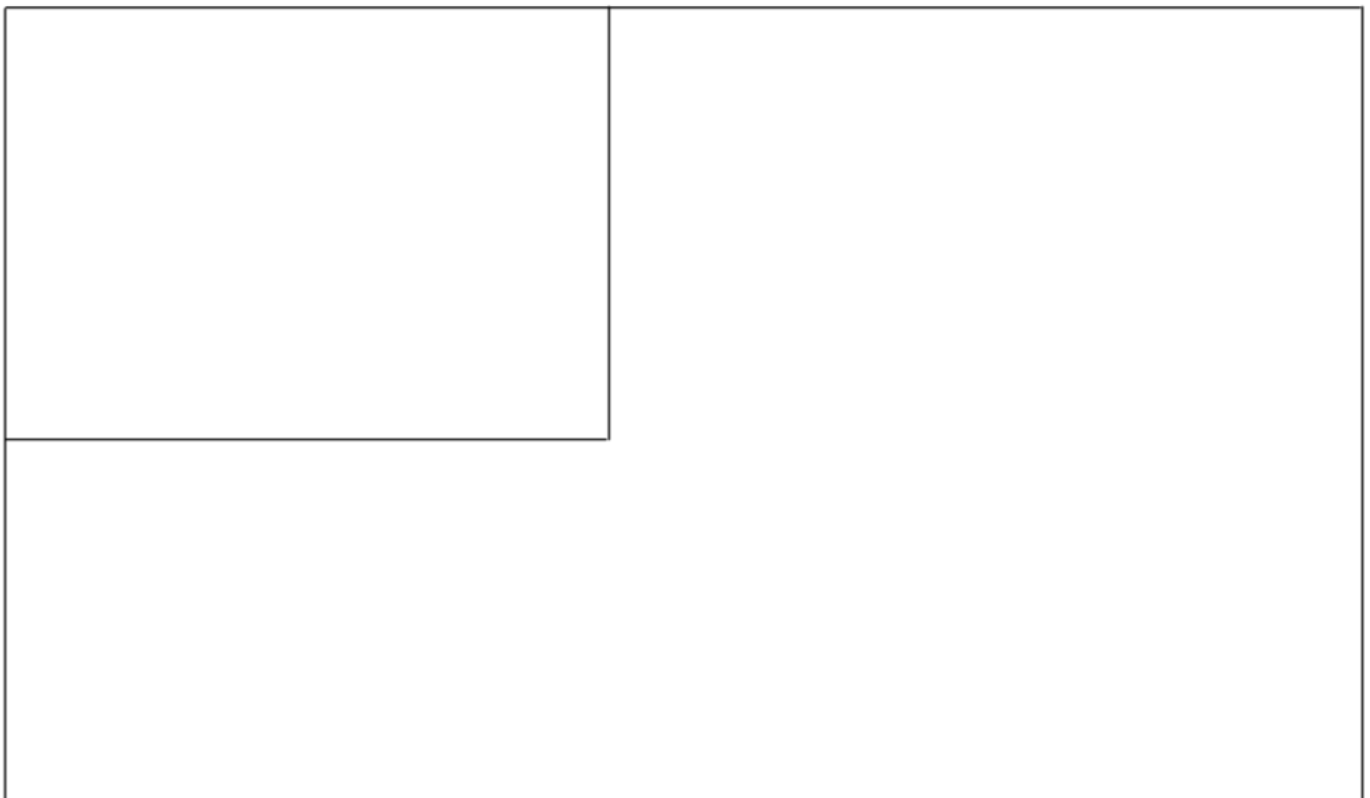
