ephedra decoction

- ma huang
- gui zhi
- xing ren
- zhi gan cao

Releases exterior cold; stops wheezing

For taiyang excess patterns: fever and chills (more chills) WITHOUT sweating, headache, body ache, wheezing

Tongue: thin white coat **Pulse:** floating, tight

ma huang tang

ephedra decoction

Modifications:

for exterior cold with interior heat: + add shi gao, zhi mu, or huang qin	for wind-cold with dampness: + fang feng, qiang huo, bai zhu
for concurrent qi and blood deficiency: + huang qi, ren shen, dang gui, and shu di huang	to direct LU qi downward (cough, wheezing, phlegm): + su zi, sang bai pi, fu ling, chen pi
for sore throat: - reduce gui zhi by half - tian hua fen, she gan	for wind-cold with trauma: + tao ren, hong hua

- Contraindicated for patients with debility and copious urination
- Contraindicated for patients prone to bleeding (esp. from nose)
- Use caution in cases of hypertension
- Only use short periods

Releases muscle layer; harmonizes ying and wei

For taiyang deficiency patterns: fever and chills WITH sweating, headache, aversion to wind, stiff neck, nasal congestion

Tongue: thin white coat **Pulse:** floating, lax or frail

Modifications:

for nasal congestion and sneezing: + add fang feng, xin yi hua	for profuse sweating: + increase bai shao - reduce gui zhi, sheng jiang, gan cao by one third	for diarrhea due to wind-cold + summerheat-dampness: + add fu ling, ze xie
for SOB or qi stagnation: + add huo po, zhi ke, chen pi	+ if oi deficiency, add huang oi and fang feng for severe headache: • substitute chi shao for bai shao + add gao ben	for wind attack with menstrual pain (blood stasis):: • substitute chi shao for bai shao + add tao ren, hong hua, or dang gui
for heaviness in head (heat prevents yang going down): + add ju hua, chan tui	for severe vomiting: + increase bai shao, sheng jiang + add chen pi, hou po	for Spleen yang deficiency causing bleeding: + add zao xin tu, e jiao
for internal heat: + add shi gao, zhi mu, huang qin to clear heat + or add sheng ma to vent exterior	for joint pain and fatigue (dampness): + add qiang huo, fang feng	for low grade fever: + add qing hao, bai wei

- Contraindicated in most cases of exterior cold with interior heat
- Do not give to patients with internal heat (may cause nosebleed) or internal damp-heat
- · Use caution during summer or hot weather
- If prescribed incorrectly, profuse sweating, high fever, thirst, palpitations may result. Give Bai Hu Jia Ren Shen Tang to cope.

Releases exterior and muscle layer; generates fluids

For wind-cold in taiyang that constrains yangming: fever and chills WITHOUT sweating, stiff neck and upper back

Tongue: thin white coat **Pulse:** floating, tight

for severe nasal blockage:

+ add chuang xiong, huang qin, xin yi hua, jie geng

for urticaria:

+ add chan tui

for facial pain:

+ add du huo, tao he cheng qi tang

Releases exterior; transforms thin phlegm; warms LU; subdues rebellious qi

Fever and chills WITHOUT sweating, cough, wheezing, **copious, white, stringy, difficult-to-expectorate sputum**, stifling sensation in chest, body heaviness

Tongue: moist **Pulse:** floating, tight

xiao qing long tang

minor bluegreen dragon decoction

Modifications:

for severe exterior cold:

+ increase ma huang and gui zhi

for increased congestion and copious sputum:

- + increase xi xin, zhi ban xia
- + add sheng jiang

for nasal congestion, runny nose, headache:

- · substitute sheng jiang for gan jiang
- · substitute chi shao for bai shao
- + add fang feng, jing jie

- Do not use long term
- Not for conditions with heat, coughing blood, coughing due to yin deficiency
- Use caution with hypertension (substitute zhi ma huang for ma huang)

nine-ingredient decoction with notopterygium

For wind-cold-damp with internal heat accumulation

Fever and chills (more chills) without sweating, headache, stiff neck, aches and pains, slight thirst, bitter taste

Tongue: white coat **Pulse:** floating

jiu wei qiang huo tang

nine-ingredient decoction with notopterygium

Modifications:

for upper back and shoulder pain: + add qin jiao	for dry or sore throat: + jie geng, niu bang zi, bo hei
for absence of thirst or bitter taste: - remove huang qin, sheng di huangi	for epigastric discomfort with greasy tongue: - remove sheng di huang + add huo xiang, zhi ban xiai
for thirst and irritability: + add shi gao, zhi mui	for coughing up thick sputum: + add xing ren, qian hu

- · Contraindicated in warm pathogen diseases (this formula is warm and drying)
- Use care in patients with yin deficiency

for severe headache: + add qiang huo, cong bai	for nosebleed and spitting blood:: - remove sheng jiang + add sheng di huang, chi shao, dan shen, mu dan pig	for dry retching (water qi in exterior): + add ban xia, fu ling
for sweating and aversion to wind: + add gui zhi, bai shao	for swelling and pain in throat: + add jie geng, niu bang zi, bo he	for plum-pit qi: + add jie geng, zi su geng
for food stagnation: + add shan zha, mai ya, lai fu zi	for constipation: + add lai fu zi, zhi ke	during menstruation: + add dang gui, dan shen
for thirst and rough urination: + add fu ling, mu tong	for cold extremities and cold in middle: + add gan jiang, rou gui	for wind-cold after giving birth: + add pao jiang, gan jiang, dang gui
for coughing and wheezing: + add jie geng, qian hu, xing ren	for concurrent summerheat: + add zhi mu, huang qin

For early-stage wind-heat: slight fever, cough, slight thirst, eye disorders

for qi-level dryness: + add shi gao, zhi mu	for pronounced thirst: + add tian hua fen	for sore throat: + add niu bang zi, ma bo
for ying-level heat: + add xuan shen, xi jiao	for thick yellow sputum: + add gua lou pi, zhe bei mu	for wind-heat affecting eyes: + add ci ji li, jue ming zi, xi ku cao
for heat entering xue level: - remove lu gen, bo he + add mai men dong, sheng di huang, yu zhu, mu dan pi	for labored breathing, slight wheezing: + add shi gao, zhi mu	
for severe Lung heat: + add huang qin	for blood-streaked sputum: + add mu dan pi, bai mao gen, ou jie

for stifling sensation in chest: + add huo xiang	for nosebleed: - remove jing jie + add bai mao gen, zhi zi	for diarrhea with yellow tongue coat: + add ge gen huang qin huang lian tang	
for severe thirst: + add tian hua fen	for dampness causing stifling sensation in chest: + add huo xiang, yu jin	for acute endometriosis: - remove gan cao, dan zhu ye + add zhi zi, fang feng, sheng di huang	
for pronounced cough: + add xing ren	for early-stage measles: + add chan tui, fu ping		
for heat entering interior, scanty urine: + add sheng di huang, mai men dong, huang qin, zhi mu, zhi zi	for early-stage carbuncles: + add pu gong ying, da qing ye		

Cautions/Contraindications:

• Ineffective in cases of damp-heat

Releases muscle layer; clears interior heat

For unresolved wind-cold that has become constrained and is turning into heat (aka **simultaneous taiyang and yangming disorder**).

Increasing fever and decreasing chills, headache, stiff extremities, eye pain, dry nasal passages, irritability, insomnia

Tongue: thin yellow coat

Pulse: floating, slightly flooding

bupleurum and kudzu decoction to release the muscle layer

Modifications:

for severe chills without sweating: - substitute ma huang for huang qin	for dry mouth and tongue: + add zhi mu and tian hua fen
for cases without chills, headache, or pain: - remove qiang huo, bai zhi	for cough with thick phlegm: + add gua lou pi, zhe bei mu
for cases without chills but with more severe heat: + add jin yin hua, lian qiao + increase shi gao	

Cautions/Contraindications:

• Inappropriate for simple exterior wind-heat disorders

Releases muscle layer; vents rashes

For **early-stage measles** or rashes, fever and chills, headache, generalized body ache, sneezing, coughing, red eyes, tearing, thirst

Tongue: red, dry **Pulse:** floating, rapid

cimicifuga and kudzu decoction

Modifications:

to assist venting pathogens from exterior: + add bo he, chan tui, jing jie, niu bang zi	for swollen and sore throat: + add jie geng, xuan shen, ma bo
for heat toxicity:	if rash is dark red:
+ add lian qiao, jin yin hua	+ add zi cao, mu dan pi
for coughing and wheezing: + add jie geng, zhi ke, qian hu, xing ren	for yangming disorders with thirst: • substitute bai shao for chi shao
to prevent damage to fluids:	for viral rashes (herpes zoster):
+ add sha shen, mai men dong	+ add zi cao

- Contraindicated for rashes that surface evenly (this may cause exterior deficiency)
- Inappropriate for measles toxin sinking internally (shortness of breath, coughing, wheezing)
- Use caution with warm pathogen diseases

for wind-cold headache:

- remove bo he
- + add sheng jiang, zi su ye

for chronic headache:

+ add hong hua, tao ren, bai jiang can, quan xie

for wind-heat headache:

- remove qiang huo, xi xin
- + add ju hua, man jing zi

for alter focus to specific channel:

- · tai yang (occipital): gao ben
- shao yang (temporal): chai hu
- · yang ming (frontal): ge gen
- jue yin (vertex): wu zhu yu, di long

Cautions/Contraindications:

ginseng powder to overcome pathogenic influences

Modifications:

normal qi is not weak; cold symptoms pronounced: - remove ren shen + add jing jie, fang feng	for dysenteric disorders with abdominal pain: + add mu xiang, bai shao
if coughing severe: + add xing ren, bai qian	for wind-toxin papules: + add chan tui, ku shen
for malarial disorders: + increase chai hu + add huang qin, bing lang	normal qi is not weak; cold symptoms pronounced: - remove ren shen + add lian qiao, jin yin hua

- Only for wind-cold-dampness (this formula is warm and drying)
- · Contraindicated for heat or damp-heat

Alternating fever and chills, fullness in chest and hypochondria, bitter taste in the mouth, nausea, vomiting, fullness and pain in epigastrium, burning diarrhea or no bowel movement, melancholy, slight irritability

Tongue: yellow coat **Pulse:** wiry, forceful

for chest and epigastric pain: + add mu xiang, yu jin, yin chen	for acute jaundice: + add zhi zi, huang bai
for severe abdominal pain: + add yan hu suo, wu yao, xiang fu	for marked chills: + add ma huang, lian qiao, chi xiao dou
for severe nausea and vomiting: + add zhu ru, xuan fu hua, huang lian	for acute cholecystitis: + add jin yin hua, lian qiao, pu gong ying, zi hua di ding
for uncontrolled, continuous vomiting: + add wu zhu yu, huang lian	for gallstones: + add jin qian cao, shi wei, hai jin sha

Strong fever and chills, light-headedness, red and sore eyes, difficulty swallowing, nasal congestion, thick nasal discharge, bitter taste, dry mouth, stifling sensation in chest, constipation, dark rough urine

Tongue: red with yellow coat

Pulse: rapid

for cases without strong chills:

for cases without strong fever:

- remove shi gao

for cough with phlegm:

+ add zhi ban xia

Releases exterior and drains heat

Fever, sweating, thirst, foul-smelling diarrhea that burns the anus, irritability, heat in chest, wheezing

For interior heat when exterior has not been completely resolved. Usually due to improper use of purgatives during external attack.

Pulse: rapid

Cautions/Contraindications:

• Contraindicated for dysenteric disorders with fever and a submerged, slow pulse
