How to Complete the Course

You get access to all the lessons as soon as you sign up for the course, so you can complete the lessons as quickly or as slowly as you want. If you would like to work through over the course over the next 10 days, see the suggested Course Schedule below. This schedule should give you time to go through all the lessons one-by-one and *practice your writing*. You will not improve if you only read the worksheets and/or listen to the videos. You need to *take action!*

In every lesson, you should:

- *Watch* the video and *make notes*
- *Copy* all my essays by hand, using a pencil (boring but important)
- *Complete* the worksheet, including *writing your own essays*
- *Read* your essays and *edit* them or *rewrite* them
- *Ask* questions and/or *write* comments under the lessons (or email me)
- *Review and remember* new vocabulary (focus on synonyms and collocations)

10	M7L1+2: Your Turn	<i>Finally, you can submit your writing to me and get detailed feedback</i>

Remember, you will only improve your writing ability if you actually do the work! You will need to spend a minimum of 2 hours per day improving your writing - and it may take you longer than 10 days to fully complete all the course materials.

I suggest working through the course at a speed that works for you. If it takes you longer than 10 days to finish it, that is totally fine. It is much more important to understand each lesson and develop your writing skills than it is to finish the course quickly!
