Phonics Phase 5

This course is for parents and carers of children in Year 1 who may need a bit of support with their reading.

Also if your child is in year 2 or above and still struggling with alternative pronunciations and spellings and the more tricky digraphs this will give you ideas how to support your child.









Letters and Sounds



It is based on the guide that is used in many schools in England.









Module 1



Module 1 gives you background information and is not necessary to read before you start teaching your child - this is if you are interested.

The sections are clearly marked with what they are about.













Module 2 gives you resources from previous phases e.g. the letters from Phase 2, 3 and 4 plus how to pronounce these sounds.









Module 3



I have put a number of short videos in section 3 to explain different ideas. They are here so that you will find them in easy to find if you wish.

Where applicable these videos will occur in the later modules too.













Module 4 is all about games you can play.

If your child is an active learner this will be especially useful as it will give you tips e.g. how to use football to practise decoding.

There are board games and blank templates for you to print off, adapt and use which makes this very specific to what your child might need to focus on.

There are also lots of other tips.











Module 5 onwards

Module 5 onwards is where the teaching starts.

Modules 5-9 are in greater detail as you are getting used to the ideas and I have explained everything so it is easy to follow.











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In the later weeks I have compressed this information as you will be familiar now.

If you are unsure about something you can always go back to an earlier week to listen to something again.
















Everyone works differently so I have put this course together so that you can choose how to use this.

How to use this Different ways

You may want to listen to some of the narrated PowerPoints just before the session and try and remember what to teach.

Having the plans there may act as an aide memoire.

If you listen to the introduction and just your day it won't take long to listen.











How to use this Different ways

To reduce printing out you could listen to the PowerPoint and then have the relevant PDFs open on the computer as a reminder. You can show your child the words to read from the computer screen and write the words on a whiteboard using the computer to remind you of examples of which words to use.











I have used the Comic Sans font for the words as this is the font which is used by many teachers so your child should be familiar with this if you decide for them to read this from the computer screen.

However the answers are also there - e.g. what sound buttons to use.

Or you may just read the PDFs (although there is more information if you listen to the videos).

You can read them on the computer screen or print of the relevant slides you wish to refer to.

This course is different to other internet resources as it will lead you and your child in a systematic way and as there is an element of fun I hope that you will both enjoy this more than doing many worksheets.


Working together will also mean that you know how well your child is doing, what s/he needs extra practice therefore you can adjust the pace of your teaching to the pace of your child's learning.






















Day by day


Although it may look overwhelming this course is meant to be over an entire academic year - so 30 weeks.
