Lesson 10: Pulling it Together & Final Assignment Manual © Syndee Rogers

This video was filmed in Photoshop Elements but the instructions are just the same in Adobe Photoshop unless where noted.

- Open the Grunged Starburst overlay (File > Open) from the All Grunged Up lesson.
- Make a duplicate copy (File > Duplicate). (Photoshop: Image > Duplicate.)
- · Close the original document.
- Open the Yellow brush texture (File > Open) from the Creating Textures with Brushes Part 3.
- Open the Rainbow paper (File > Open) from the Gradient Blends lesson.

Add Papers to Overlay

- Activate the Yellow brush texture paper, click and drag it over to the Grunged Starburst document. This will be the background.
- In the Layers panel, drag the Yellow paper layer down above the white background.
- Press Ctrl J (Mac: Cmd J) to make duplicate the layer.
- In the Layers panel, change the Blend Mode to Multiply.
- Activate the Rainbow brush paper, then click and drag that over on to the Grunged Starburst document.
- In the Layers panel, drag it up above the Starburst overlay layer.
- Press Ctrl Alt G (Mac: Cmd Opt G) to clip it to the Starburst overlay layer.
- Press Ctrl J (Mac: Cmd J) to make duplicate the layer.
- Press Ctrl Alt G (Mac: Cmd Opt G) to clip it to the original Rainbow paper layer.
- In the Layers panel, change the Blend Mode to Multiply.

- Find an image or something where the colors jump out and inspire you.
- · Use the image along with the Color Swatch template to create a color palette
- Create 3 or more papers.
- Save as PSD files.
- Save a jpg version.
