In the afternoon, at 1 o'clock, Tom plays video games with his brother. After that, they go out **together**. At 6 pm, Tom goes to the pool to swim. He meets his friends there and they have a **chat**.

Tom **watches** television and drinks tea in the evening. He goes to bed at 11.30.

THE SIMPLE PRESENT TENSE

POSITIVE

- I go to school every day.
- You speak English well.
- He takes a walk every morning.
- She likes her friends a lot.
- My dog swims in the pool.
- We read books every evening.
- They talk to each other every day.

NEGATIVE

- I don't go to school every day.
- You don't speak English well.
- He doesn't take a walk every morning.
- She doesn't like her friends a lot.
- My dog doesn't swim in the pool.
- We don't read books every evening.
- They don't talk to each other every day.

QUESTIONS

A: Do you go to school every day?

B: Yes, I do. / No, I don't.

A: Does she like her friends?

B: Yes, she does. / No, she doesn't.
