How to use this workshop?

Thank you for signing up for this workshop! The lessons will not only improve your reading and listening skills, but you will also improve your vocabulary and sentence building. Each story and conversation focus on everyday subjects with diverse vocabulary and tones to keep it interesting.

You get a new lesson daily (story or conversation). You can either connect yourself or wait for my email to remind you to check your new lesson.

Each lesson consists of:

- A story or a conversation
- 3 audio at 3 different speeds: slow normal fast
- A PDF with missing words exercise and questions

Here is how the PDF is broken down:

- Page 1: Transcript of the story or conversation with missing words
- Page 2: Transcript of the story or conversation, including the missing words in bold
- Page 3: Translation of the story or conversation in English
- Page 4: 10 easy questions in French and English
- Page 5: Answers to the questions in French and English
- Page 6: Focused vocabulary (underlined on page 2)
- Page 7: For you to take notes

How to use the lessons?

There are many ways to use this workshop, but here is how I recommend it:

- **Step 1:** Take the transcription on page 1, listen to the slow or normal-speed audio (depending on your level), and read the transcription simultaneously. Try to find the missing words. You can listen to the audio as many times as you want.
- **Step 2:** Read the story while listening to the 3 audios. This will help build your ability to understand fast-spoken French.
- **Step 3:** Answer the questions by what you remember or referring to the transcription.
- **Step 4:** Check your answers and correct your answers.
- **Step 5:** Learn new focused vocabulary if you want to.
- **Step 6:** Repeat tomorrow.

Don't hesitate to download the audio on your phone or computer to listen to it whenever you have time.

As I said, there are many ways to use this workshop. If you don't like missing word exercises, skip them. If you prefer to listen first without reading, it's up to you.

You know what works best for you, so use the material how you want to approach it. Just remember to have fun while learning.
