ABSTRACT

Neighbor-love was a revolutionary idea in ancient culture. It changed the way people saw one another across race, ethnicity, gender, class, politics, and religion. And yet neighbor-love has been tragically neglected or taken for granted in many churches and Christian culture. Where did the idea of neighbor-love come from? What does it actually mean and require in practice? And how can we become ambassadors of neighbor-love in the twenty-first century?

Neighbor-Love: A Revolutionary Idea that Could Save Our World is the first video course devoted entirely to the ethics of neighbor-love. Combining scholarly depth, popular accessibility, and practical application, this course will immerse you in the history, meaning, and practice of neighbor-love. It makes a passionate case for why we should champion neighbor-love today as the center of our lives, churches, and cultures.

Here we'll explore the development, corruption, and critique of neighbor-love in Christian ethics, providing crucial lessons for us today.

Lecture 6: Modern Masters of Neighbor-Love dives more deeply into five of the most inspiring 20th century preachers and practitioners of neighbor-love: Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Martin Luther King, Jr., Oscar Romero, Mother Teresa, and Jean Vanier. These modern masters can serve as paradigms for our future.

Lecture 7: Neighbor-Love Now: A Humble/Dangerous/Hopeful New Beginning for Humanity introduces three exemplars of neighbor-love today (Coach Wayne Gordon, Gary Haugen, and Eden Gelan); summarizes our findings from the previous six lectures; unpacks answers to fifteen questions about the ethics of neighbor-love today; and concludes the course with a final commission for ambassadors of neighbor-love in our world
