



Children's Version








We are 95 percent water when we are born. We are 70 percent water when we are an adult. Therefore, we are mostly water. On top of that, we are always surrounded by water.

Our earth is the same. 70 percent of its surface is covered by water. That is why our planet is called the "Water Planet". Isn't earth very much like us?

Water comes in many different forms; rain water, river water, sea water and water floating about in the sky as clouds or fog. All water is precious to us.

How would we know if one type of water is good or bad? Here is an idea, let's take a look at photographs of crystals found in frozen water.



Look, this is a photograph of a water crystal. Notice how it shines and dances.



Can you see that all are hexagonal (6 sides), but all are different and unique?

Different places in the world have different features. Water is the same. Water shows different crystal forms depending on the place or conditions in which it is found. Have you ever wondered how your local water may look?





Sanbu-ichi Yusui spring water, Japan

This water is known as the miracle spring. People from all parts of the world gather around this special spring water.






Shimanto River (Midstream), Japan

Groundwater in Northern Island, New Zealand


On this island, you can swim in the ocean and ski in the mountains on the same day. The local people know water is important on this island and they know the importance of preserving their groundwater.

Playing music to water

Can music change water? To find out, water would need to listen to music. What type of music shall we use? How long should water listen to the music? How loud should the music be? Where should the water be placed?


Research was done to find out. There were many factors to think about before playing music to water.

Here is what we tried: We placed a bottle of water between two speakers and played an entire song at normal volume. Then we tapped the bottom of the water bottle and left it overnight.

The next day, we tapped the bottle again before freezing the water to make crystal photographs.








Beethoven's Pastorale

This is a bright, happy, joyous music. This beautiful crystal tells us that good music can positively affect water.








Bach's Air for the G String

Tchaikovsky's Swan Lake


This music tells a story of a girl who is turned into a swan by a demon. Doesn't the crystal look like a sad swan?





Summer - It has fully bloomed.






Vivaldi's *The Four Seasons*: Spring, Summer Autumn, Winter

The lyric was full of anger. The crystal has broken in pieces. Could the words in this song have caused this?








It stores the energy until the coming of another spring.

Showing words to water





Did you know that spoken words have vibration? We thought there may be a difference between softly saying "aren't you a fool" and screaming "you fool!" to someone. We did the following experiment: We placed a typed label saying "thank you" on one bottle and "you fool" on the other and left them both overnight.


Later, we froze these water samples and took the crystal photographs. We found that water crystals were different depending on the words spoken or shown. We did the same experiment many times and we always got similar results.



Thank you/You fool

These bottles of water had the words "thank you" and "you fool" left on them overnight. The word "thank you" in Japanese means to be grateful for our own existence.












Do it/Let's do it

Can you see the difference between the bossiness of "do it" and the softness of "let's do it"?


しなさい Do it A beautiful crystal formed when we showed the word "You're beautifull". A dirty crystal formed when we showed the word "dirty".

Doesn't the beauty in this crystal give you hope?




War

This crystal may not be as beautiful, but it's trying to get better. Could despair be the beginning of a new hope?












Showing images to water

Look how water can copy what it was shown. A cute little heart appeared!








Communicating our feelings to water








The most extraordinary photograph

Let's try An Experiment by an Elementary School Student

Rice experiment saying "thank you" and "you fool".



An elementary school student placed cooked rice in two different glass containers. Every time she came back from school, she said "thank you" to one and "you fool" to the other. She did this for one month and observed the change. The result was that the rice that received "thank you" fermented and produced a good odor, whereas the rice that received "you fool" turned black with mold and produced a foul smell.

As part of the United Nation's International Decade for Action: Water for Life, Dr. Emoto wishes to share his discoveries about the responsive nature of water with children around the world through this book. Completed in 2006, this book presenting Dr. Emoto's research from his first book, "The Message of Water", is provided to all the children in the world at no cost. This effort is called the "EMOTO PROJECT." The project, over the decade, will seek to reach every child on the planet with this message: water is me; water is life; peaceful water means peaceful me means a peaceful world. In this way, children around the world-raised in tune with the sacred nature of themselves as water beings and the sacred nature of every drop of water—will bring peace to the world.
