How to Use the Character Map for Dingbats

Use the Character Map in Windows or Font Book on a Mac to utilize the amazing shape power of the mighty dingbat.

For this tutorial you will need:


- a dingbat font (provided in the download)
- Adobe Photoshop or Photoshop Elements

Quick Steps

- Download and install a dingbat font.
- Open a document and reset the Color Chips.
- Activate the dingbat font.
- Add a placeholder cursor and click the checkmark.
- **Windows Only:** Copy a dingbat character from the Character Map.
- **Mac Only:** Copy a dingbat character from Font Book.
- Paste in the copied character.

Dingbats are typically a font file that contains images. They are sometimes called Ornaments.



Download & Install a Dingbat Font

- Download a dingbat font or open the one included in the download folder for this video.
- Right click (Mac: Ctrl click) on the font file (usually a .otf or .ttf file) and choose Open.
- Click Install (Mac: Install Font).

Prepare Your Workspace

- Create a new 12x12 inch document (File > New > Blank File) at 300 ppi with a white background. (PS: Choose File > New.)
- Press the letter D to reset the Color Chips to the default of black over white.


Activate the Dingbat Font & Place the Cursor

- Get the Horizontal Type tool.
- In the Tool Options, open the Font Picker and choose the dingbat font you just installed. I'll choose Suit Icons. Set the Size to 150.
- On the document, click once in the center to place the cursor, then click the checkmark to commit the change.

NOTE: In PSE, the document should still be blank. In PS, there should be Lorem Ipsum placeholder text.


(Windows Only) Copy a Dingbat from the Character Map

- Click on Start and search for Character Map. Click to open the Character Map app.
- In the Character Map, open the Font dropdown menu and choose the dingbat font you're using on your document. I'll choose Suit Icons.
- Click on a character to preview it and select it.
- Click on Select, then click on Copy.



(Mac Only) Copy a Dingbat from Font Book

- Click on the Search icon and search for Font Book. Click to open the Font Book app.
- In Font Book, click on User in the left column.
- Click on the dingbat font you're using on your document. I'll choose Suit Icons.
- Click on the Repertoire Preview Mode icon.
- Click on a character to activate it.
- Press Cmd C to copy the character.



Paste in the Copied Character

- Return to your document.
- In the Layers panel, double click on the thumbnail of the type layer to activate the cursor again. (PS: Double click on the thumbnail of the type layer to highlight all the current type.)
- Press Ctrl V (Mac: Cmd V) to paste the dingbat character.
- Click the checkmark to commit the change.
