

BRINGING YOUR PUPPY HOME

Checklist

If you are about to bring your new puppy home, or you already have your puppy, you may be feeling a little nervous... "am I ready, have I got everything I need!"

Don't worry, here is a checklist to guide you on some of the items you may need and tips on how to make your home 'puppy safe'.

These are only guidelines, as individual circumstances may differ.

→ PUPPY SAFETY	
Keep your trash bins secure and well out of puppy's reach	
Keep electrical cords out of reach	
Puppies love to chew, remove any hazards that your puppy could eat or choke on	
Keep all medications in a secure cabinet	
Store any poisons, batteries, or garage items safely and securely	
Research the plants in and around your home to make sure they are non-toxic, remove toxic plants or relocate out of your puppy's reach	
Check your yard to ensure fencing and gates are secure	
Check for hazards such as fence/railing panels where your puppy could get his head stuck or slip through	
Safeguard your puppy from heaters and fireplaces	
→ PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR PUPPY'S ARRIVAL	
Stainless steel, non-slip food and water bowls	
Identification tag with your puppy's name, your phone and your vet's phone number	
Vet contact information	
Collar and lead	
Crate - crate training is a great tool for house training your puppy	
Baby gate - baby gate is also a great tool for house training your puppy	
Fire/heater screen	
Bedding	
Enzymatic cleaner for house training accidents	
Puppy shampoo, grooming tools (ie. brush, comb), dog toothbrush/paste	
Old towels	
Quality, safe toys including chew toys to ease teething	
Flea, tick and parasite controls as recommended by your vet	
Puppy food and treats for training
