Supplies List

Paint colors

Following are the colors we'll use in this course. Use whichever brand of professional grade paints you prefer. I'm painting with oils, but you can use acrylics if you prefer.

- Burnt Sienna
- Van Dyke Brown
- Cassel Earth (by LUKAS 1862)¹
- Dioxazine Purple
- Ultramarine Blue
- Cobalt Blue
- Phthalo Blue
- Sap Green

- **Titanium White**
- Yellow Ochre
- Cadmium Yellow Light
- Cadmium Yellow Deep
- Cadmium Red Light
- Alizarin Crimson Hue²
- Transparent Earth Red (for Underpainting only if you can't find this color, you can use another transparent reddish color such as Burnt Sienna)

¹I personally prefer the LUKAS 1862 brand of Cassel Earth, which has a unique, purplish cast. If you can't find this brand, you can mix Van Dyke Brown with a bit of Alizarin Crimson and white to achieve something similar. (See the bonus video on mixing this color.)

²Alizarin Crimson Hue is a more lightfast version of the original alizarin crimson. Some brands may call it Permanent Alizarin Crimson.

Brushes

- We'll use a variety of brushes in the course. I'm using the Princeton Brush series listed below. Use whichever brand of brush you prefer.
- The brush sizes listed are based on the 16"x20" course painting. If you work larger or smaller, please adjust your brush sizes accordingly.
- The measurements listed are the width of the brush (the size number will vary from • brand to brand).
 - Aspen large flat for imprimatura (2")
 - #3 Catalyst Angle Bright (1/4" or 6.4 mm)
 - #6 Catalyst Angle Bright (1/2" or 25.36 mm)
 - #8 Catalyst Short Filbert (5/8" or 15.34 mm)
 - #6 Catalyst Flat (1/2" or 11.85 mm)
 - #10 Catalyst Flat (3/4" or 19.58 mm)
 - #2 Catalyst Filbert (1/4" or 6 mm)
 - #4 Catalyst Filbert (3/8" or 9.54 mm)
 - #2 Catalyst Round (.14" or 3.43 mm)

- #6 Imperial Bright (1/4" or 5.7mm)
- #2 Imperial Round (1/16" or 1.7 mm)
- #4 Imperial Round (1/4" or 6.66 mm)
- #4 Imperial Flat (3/16" or 4.71 mm)
- #6 Imperial Short Filbert (1/4" or 5.73 mm)
- #2 Imperial Short Filbert (1/8" or 2.95 mm)
- Velvetouch Oval Mop (3/4")
- #2/0 Velvetouch Script Liner (.04" or .97 mm)

Custom brushes

We'll also use some custom texture brushes. You can make the texture brushes or use old worn brushes if you have them. (Watch the demo videos inside the course on making custom brushes.)

- Cheap or old round brushes in a variety of sizes
- Cheap flat bristle or chip brush (1 1/2")
- Cheap flat bristle or chip brush (1/2")

Other supplies

Here are the other supplies you'll need in the course.

- Primed canvas or panel (16"x20" or the same proportion)
- Liquin from Winsor & Newton or other alkyd medium (for oil painters)
- Artists' Painting Medium from Winsor & Newton (for oil painters) used for oiling out at the end
- 📃 #2 pencil
- Conte pencil or other drawing tool
- Kneaded eraser
- Spray fixative (I recommend Workable Fixatif from Krylon)
- Odorless Mineral Spirits or turpentine substitute (for oil painters)
 Note: I'm using Gamsol OMS for the imprimatura stage. Once that's done, I use Chelsea's Lavender Brush Cleaner.
- Container for mineral spirits (oil painters) or for water (acrylic painters)
- Rubber or nitrile gloves
- Paper towels
- Palette
- Ruler
- Triangle
- Scissors and / or X-Acto style knife (for making custom brushes)
- Mahl stick (very useful, but not required)
