Step 1: Write down 10 to 20 words that describe you – the good and the not-so-good, personally, professionally, privately, publicly and secretly (make sure to capture all five).



What does the Bible say about non-believers?

2 Peter 2: <sup>19</sup> "...for people are slaves to whatever has mastered them." <sup>20</sup> If they have escaped the corruption of the world by knowing our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and are again entangled in it and are overcome, they are worse off at the end than they were at the beginning. <sup>21</sup> It would have been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than to have known it and then to turn their backs on the sacred command that was passed on to them. <sup>22</sup> Of them the proverbs are true: "A dog returns to its vomit," and, "A sow that is washed returns to her wallowing in the mud."

Recall what happened to the people Moses led out of Egypt - they did not get to enter the Promise Land. I do not want that to happen to you.

When you are living in harmony with God, when you are your best self, your spiritual self, your divine self, then experiencing purpose, peace & prosperity in your financial life will come easy to you. Your life will be as functional and orderly as all of God's creation is. Think about the laws of the universe associated with gravity, magnets, mathematics and so forth.
