## DON ANDREWS MATERIAL LIST

## PAPER

Sketchbook 8.5" x 11"
Watercolor paper of good quality (I use Arches 140\# Rough and Cold Press)

## BRUSHES

I use Robert Simmons synthetic white sable American Journey interlocking nylon brushes Winsor Newton 1" flat synthetic
Round brushes include sizes 36, 26, 14,12,10
Flat brushes include 2", 1.5", 1"


## PAINT

I am often asked what colors I have on my palette. I'm listing the colors I currently use though it's not important that you have the same colors. I emphasize that you should have 2 light, 2 medium, and 2 dark of all primary colors. Most professional brands are interchangeable and include Holbein, Windsor Newton, and Daniel Smith. I use American Journey watercolors from Cheap Joes Art Stuff. (The colors below are listed from light to dark in each column.)

## EASEL

I use a French box easel and work on a 45 degree slant. You can improvise by leaning your board against something as long as it's secure and not too sharp an angle.


## PALETTE

Robert E Wood palette with lid.
Two or three butchers trays for mixing only.


## MIRROR

Hang a mirror on your studio wall opposite your easel. I stand up when painting and constantly look at my painting in the mirror as it progresses. This way I see the painting backwards (abstractly) which always points out design problems. If you sit while you paint, or paint plein air, use a hand mirror.
