




etc; and bound to see more. Parents have started to move from the traditional after school tutoring to these mobile applications which is laudable.

## **GOOGLE CLASSROOMS:**

- In 2019 Google announced that its Chromebooks have been used by 30 million students and educators worldwide while the Google Classroom program now has 40 million users.
- Google's G Suite for Education has reached 80 million users since it first debuted back in 2006.



- It includes popular web-based productivity tools such as Gmail, Google Drive, Docs, Sheets, and Slides, as well as Calendar, Jamboard, and Hangouts
- 40 million students and educators rely on Google Classroom to stay organized and support creative teaching techniques.
- In May 2018, Google shared that the tool for starting classroom discussions had 25 million users, reports 9to5Google. Since then, the company has added a number of features such as Stream redesign and the Google Material Theme.



There is also a flip side to this story, what about the homes who cannot afford to have this technology at home, below the poverty line. Does a country like India have amenities to make this available to all classes of people?

Yes, we aren't far behind.

- Back in 2018, 133 teachers of 13 Zilla Parishad (ZP) Schools, were trained in Google Classroom.
- The 13 ZP schools are following the new Maharashtra International Education Board (MIEB) started by the state education ministry since June.



- The state had started this project on a pilot basis in 13 schools, which will have this board for Class 4.
- 100 schools had been selected which can register online to adopt this board. Basis of selection was if they fall under at Zilla Parishad (ZP), Nagar Palika or Municipal Corporation, aided and self financed

This is just one example from India, and use of one technological tool.

If the current lockdown continues for a larger span of time, it requires a major change in delivery on part of schools.

A time of crisis is also an opportunity for all education systems to look into the future, adjust to possible threats, and build their capacity.

We have enormous potential for this to happen regardless of COVID 19 if we only took that cue and took a step forward.
