

m7 4th Chords

In this section, you learn m7 4th chords based on the Dorian mode.

To begin, here are Dm7 4th chord shapes based around the Drop 3 chord with a 5th-string root.

Start by playing through these shapes over the D root note, then take them to other keys when ready.

From there, comp over the Dm7 backing track with these shapes to take them to a musical situation.

Dm7

Lastly, mix these new shapes with the previous Dm7 4th chords over the Dm7 backing track to cover more of the fretboard in your comping.
