POLITY AND ORDINANCES OF THE BRETHREN CHURCH

Course Instructor & Facilitator: G. Emery Hurd Updated August 2021

- 1. **Course Description:** This course examines the polity of the church from a Brethren and Believers' Church perspective. It provides an overview of the organizational structure of the Brethren Church at the local, regional, and national levels. Consideration is given to both the doctrine and practice of the ordinances. It will familiarize the student with all the documents used by the Brethren Church to define, govern, and practice its polity at all levels.
- 2. **Textbooks and Other Materials:** The following textbooks are required for the course:
 - Eberly, William R., ed. *The Complete Writings of Alexander Mack.* Winona Lake, IN: BMH Books, 1991.
 - The Readings Packet which will be available on the course website and broken into 10 sections, with a reference to the two break weeks, where no reading is expected.
 - All documents referenced in the syllabus, which will be available on the course website.
- 3. Attendance and Participation Policy: Attendance at all class sessions is expected unless the facilitators have been notified in advance. Students should be on time and should stay through the duration of all classes. Missing more than one class, unless approved in advance, will result in need for students to retake the course later. Students are expected to read the documents referenced in the syllabus before each class and participate in class discussions. Failure to come prepared for classes will result in students needing to retake the course.
- 4. **Writing Policy:** All papers must employ proper English and notation in accord with the most recent edition of Kate L. Turabian's *A Manual for Writers of Term Papers, Theses, and Dissertations*. In cases where Turabian needs to be supplemented the most recent edition of *The Chicago Manual of Style* should be consulted. Alternately, APA or MPA writing standards may be used if usage is consistent throughout the course.

 - Discuss a model for local church organization. How are Brethren principles and values expressed in the model you describe?
 - Describe consensus decision making. Give an example of what a consensus process might look like in a local congregation.
 - Discuss the relative roles of elder, local church, region, and denomination in Brethren polity.
 - Describe what roles and authority Brethren documents have in the context of Brethren polity and limited congregationalism.
