Modal verbs: should, must, have to – Exercises

Exercise 1: Find the mistake and correct it.

Example:

We mustn't ~~to arrive~~ late.

... We mustn't arrive late. ...

1. I don't must forget his name.

2. I think he should apologise to her.

3. She hasn't to wear a uniform.

4. He must has missed his train.

5. Have I to answer this question?

Exercise 2: Use 'should', 'must', or 'have to' to express the following.

Examples:

Ask for my advice whether to learn Spanish.

... **Should I learn Spanish?** ...

Say that it's necessary that we do not disturb him.

... **We mustn't disturb him.** ...

Say that it's an obligation for him to finish his work.

... **He has to finish his work.** ...

Say that it's not necessary for him to wake up early.

... **He doesn't have to wake up early.** ...

1. Say that it's not a good idea for us to park here.

2. Say that you regret spending so much money.

3. Advise me not to buy this watch.

4. Say that you expect the guests to be here soon.

5. Ask for my advice whether to apply for the job.

6. Say that it's a good idea for them to get married.

7. Express a criticism that Rose didn't tell the truth.



8. Say that it's really necessary that we apologise to him.
9. Say that you assume that she got your message.
10. Say that it's necessary that the children do not make any noise.
11. Say that you assume that he is having fun.
12. Say that it's necessary that we do not forget the code.
13. Say that it's necessary that we do not feed the cat.
14. Say that it was an obligation for them to submit a report.
15. Ask if it's an obligation for him to travel for his job.
16. Say that it's an obligation for everyone to fill in a form.
17. Ask if it's an obligation for us to work on Saturdays.
18. Ask if it was an obligation for him to sign a contract.
19. Say that it's not necessary for her to have an interview.
20. Say that it was not necessary for them to fire him.
