Acrylic paints – bottled acrylics work best, assortment of colors with brown, white and black, can be craft paints.

Collage and Found and papers - small variety of papers you might want to use to collage with. - sheet music, old book pages, misc. old letters, envelopes ticket stubs, maps, etc.

Paint brushes - assortment of large 1" flat to small round tip create fine lines and for shadowing.

Baby wipes -1 tub
