Creation itself reveals that God is an artist and loves beauty. God used lines to create the heavens and earth. In nature, we see lines in trees, flowers, mountains, grass, stars, the moon and the sun. Some of God's most exquisite handiwork is on a miniature scale. Have you ever looked through a magnifying glass at a snowflake? You will see a multitude of lines creating a magnificent design. We use lines to write words and draw pictures so that we can communicate. Look around the room. Do you see any lines?

- Observe three-dimensional objects and see how lines are used in a variety of ways.
- Look for simple shapes and lines in objects.
- Use fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination in drawing lines using markers.



INSTRUCTIONS

It is good for the students to pick out the lines created in the floor tiles, ceiling tiles, the vertical lines in the window sills, and the line created by the edge of their desk or table. We have included examples of projects that show different types of line.

- 1. Teacher: "Today, we are going to talk about lines. A line is a point that moves. If I make a dot and take the dot for a walk, I just made a line."
- 2. Talk to students about where they might observe lines. Examples: nature, in the classroom, school building, walkways and roads. Show pictures of different lines cities, buildings, roads, mountains, oceans, waves, etc.
- 3. Teacher: Draw examples of different lines. Talk about where you might see a:
- Straight lines doors, desks, windows, roads etc.


- Wavy lines water, waves, hills etc.
- Zigzag lines mountains, shark teeth, the letter Z, a thunderbolt etc.
- Broken lines on roads, railroad tracks, in nature leaves, plants, grass

TIP:


Young children can make imaginary lines with their fingers in the air or with strings.

Lines can also reveal a feeling or mood. Point to the lines and ask the children how the different lines might make them feel. Discuss how they might use them in their art to create a feeling. A soft or calm mood may show a curved, thin, wavy, or continuous line.


A nervous feeling might be created with distorted or zigzag lines; assertive or angry feelings might be indicated with, solid, sharp, thick or bold lines.




Step 1
Draw two horizontal lines




Step 2 Draw three vertical lines to divide up the page.





Step 3 Draw different lines in each box. Encourage the student s to draw a different type of line in every box.





Examples:

- A shark might have zigzag teeth that feel scary.
- A distorted zigzag line can create a lightening bolt that might make you nervous.
- A landscape with wavy lines for rolling hills may invoke a calm feeling.






Elements of art

The essential parts and symbols of an artwork. Line, color, value, shape, texture, form, and space are elements of art.

Line

A mark that moves from one point to another on a surface created by a pen, pencil, or brush. A line can also define the edge of an object. For example, people use lines to write words and draw complex plans for building a house.

God is the maker of all lines because he made the heavens, earth, and everything in it. We can find lines in nature on a tiger, a spider web, a zebra, and tall skinny cactus.

Examples of lines in our world are: Lines in the road. Lines from a wire fence. Telephone wires. Cables on a tile floor.

Other concepts of a line are called contour lines, hatching, and crosshatching to create shadows. Quick lines are often called gesture lines or implied lines and can be expressive.

Definition of Doodle

-- an aimless or casual scribble, design, or sketch. I call it play time!

Shape

A shape is the form of an object or its external boundary, outline, or external surface. It can be a flat, two-dimensional area with height and width: which might have an edge, an outline, around it. There are organic shapes and geometric shapes.

Geometric Shapes

Geometric shapes are mathematical and precise. Some examples are a circle, square, triangle, oval, and rectangle are geometric shapes.
