

- Begin in Photoshop Elements or Adobe Photoshop.
- Open the scrapbook page (File > Open) that you ended with in Lesson 3, Part 2.

Select and Mask the Photo

- In the Layers panel, click on the photo layer to activate it.
- Press Ctrl J (Mac: Cmd J) to create a duplicate.
- Click on the Visibility icon of the original photo layer to hide it.
- Get the Rectangular Marquee tool.
- In the Tool Options, click on the New Selection icon. Set the Feather to 0 px and the Aspect to Normal. (PS: Set the Style to Normal.)
- On the document, click and drag a selection outline around the part of the image that you want to extend out of bounds along with part of the image that's overlapping the mask.



- In the Menu Bar, choose Select > Inverse.
- In the Layers panel, click on the Visibility icon of the original photo layer to reveal it.
- Press the Backspace key (Mac: Delete key).
 Press Ctrl D (Mac: Cmd D) to deselect.
- With the duplicate photo layer active, use the selections tools to select the subject out.



• In the Layers panel, click on the Add Layer Mask icon.
