Communication (v): imparting and sharing information

Communicate (v): communicate with: // communicative (adj.)

Be in communication with: I am still in communication with my primary school teacher.

Phrasal verbs

Get in touch with: to contact

It is easier to get in touch with people when we participate in a club.

I usually get in touch with my friends by sending text messages.

How do you get in touch with your friends? (Via, by, though)

I get in touch with my friends by WhatsApp.

Track down: find

The best way to track down a person is to stalk her/him.

Bump into: to meet sb by accident

If I bumped into an old friend after ten years, I would probably hug him.

I would probably ask if she was ok or not if I bumped into my primary school teacher.

Lose touch with: have no contact with. [Don't rub salt in the wound.]

A person I lose touch with is my primary school teacher. [let's fake it to make it.]

I lost touch with my primary school friends because they moved to different cities.

I have lost touch with my roommate because he moved to Germany.

Stay in touch with: maintain a relationship with

I like to stay in touch with honest people. /level-headed/strong-willed/modest/openminded/funny, humorous/narrow-minded.

What kind of people do you like to stay in touch with?

Happy- be over the cloud/ moon. / Feel down in the dumps: very sad. / I feel blue.

keep track of: follow what is happening (at, in, of, for, on... about, with, without + ving) Alan English Upper-Intermediate English Training

I like to keep track of my friends by following them on social media. **By means of**: by, with How do you keep track of your friends?

It is important for me to watch up-to-date YouTube videos frequently in order to keep track of technological advancements (development).

Catch up with: exchange the latest information.

The best time of day to catch up with people is morning because everyone is energetic.

The best way of catching up with political changes is to watch breaking news on YouTube.

How do you catch up with technologies?

I catch up with technologies by reading tweets.

The best way of catching up with technologies is by reading tweets.

Learn something by heart: completely memorize something.

You are supposed to learn all the words by heart before we start the new unit.

Idioms:

Action speaks louder than words: what you do is more important than what you say.

Some students want to study very hard, but action speaks louder than words.

be on the same wavelength: share similar ideas,

I am on the same wavelength as my wife, so we decide to move to Germany.

Are you on the same wavelength as your mom?

Yes, we are. Therefore, we decided to take private lessons.

Be on the same boat: we are on the same boat in terms of improving our English proficiency.

Are you in the same boat as your friend in terms of studying abroad?

I am in the same boat with only one friend in terms of studying abroad.

Think before you speak: don't start talking until you have thought about what you say.

Thinking before you speak is important, or you will have to face the consequences (results) harshly. / I think before I speak because I don't want to hurt anyone.

Think twice before you jump: consider the consequences before you take action.

Before you make a decision, it is always wise to think twice before you jump and consider the potential consequences.

Get a word in edgeways: get a chance to say something.

He would like to get a word in edgeways if he just could.

When you talk to **motor mouths**, it is difficult to get a word in edgeways.

Hear it on the grapevine: hear about a rumor passed from one person to another.

I hear on the grapevine that they've separated.

A little bird told me: hear it on the grapevine.

A little bird told me that Donald Trump is going to be the next president.

Get straight to the point: talk about the most important thing immediately.

I have to get straight to the point that you are making the same mistake again.

Keep the long story short: talkative.

Can you please keep the long story short and give me the main points of what happened?

Beat around the bush: avoid addressing a topic directly, usually talking about other things.

Please stop beating around the bush and tell me what you really think about the lesson.

Have a quick word with someone: talk briefly to someone

I want to have a quick word with you if you have time during the coffee break. He had a quick word with my dad yesterday and asked him for money.

Collocations: cooperation (n), co-worker (n), coordinate (v), coordinator (n).

Display similarities: show similar sides.

The Nordic countries display similarities as well as differences in terms of culture.

Ankara and Istanbul both display similarities in terms of population. / Natural beauty.

Be the same as / be similar to. : personality, interests, liking and dislikes, opinions.

I don't display similarities with my friends in terms of our personalities.

Establish connections: build the connection.

Many businesses have established connections with local universities in order to carry out international projects.

Establish rapport: build close relationships and understanding.

It is important to establish rapport with the audience rather than giving a report.

Teachers should establish rapport with students in the classroom.

Exhibit knowledge: to show knowledge. / Exhibit(v): to show or display.

People need to exhibit knowledge of the difference in communication.

I am good at exhibiting knowledge in a group because I have **overdose** confidence.

She is not an expert in exhibiting her knowledge in a group discussion because of her lack of confidence.

Impart information: to give information to or convey knowledge or facts.

The teachers impart a great deal of knowledge/information to their students.

Maintain status: keep status. The act of upholding a particular position or standing, social or professional context.

Man seeks to establish and maintain status and dominance, while women's communication is more equal.

Negotiate relationships: to manage or navigate your interpersonal relationship with others. Communication, compromise, and understanding to maintain a healthy and positive relationship and find common ground and resolve issues in a mutually beneficial way.

This book looks at the difficulties young people can have when they negotiate relationships with friends and family.

In order to negotiate a relationship successfully, it is important to be open, honest, and willing to listen to others' perspectives.

Negotiate status: a process of bargaining or discussion in order to establish a particular **position or level of authority** in social or professional status within a given context.

Men's communication is to preserve independence and maintain status in the hierarchical social order.
