6.	Individual Practice	Teacher Directed	Students practice alone or in small groups
7.	Component Practice 2	Video	Improvising with G mixolydian scale - Practice playing scale as quarter notes - Practice playing scale as two swung eighth notes per pitch (G-G, A-A, B-B, etc.) - Teacher improvises for one measure as the "call" and then all students improvise for one measure as the "response"
8.	Ensemble Practice	Teacher Directed	Ensemble practice mixing chords and improvising, working toward students being confident in improvising as soloists - Divide class into two groups. One group plays the 12 Bar Blues chord progression while the other group improvises, then switch roles. - Eventually, students work in pairs where one plays chords and the other improvises.
9.	Summary and Closing	Teacher Directed	Summarize and review the learning targets for this lesson (found below). Close with one more full class/ensemble performance of the 12 Bar Blues chord progression with student soloist(s) improvising.

- Perform those chords accurately in the framework of a 12 Bar Blues
- Confidently improvise melodies using the G mixolydian scale
