## Diatonic 7 Chords with Left Hand

Now have a go in your left hand, using the fingers, $5^{\text {th }}-3^{\text {rd }}-2^{\text {nd }}-$ and $1^{\text {st }}$. The only difference is, now you are identifying the chord with your $5^{\text {th }}$ finger (pinky), as appose to the thumb when finding chords with your right hand.

For example, the Cmaj7:


Put your $5^{\text {th }}$ finger on the C and then just use the same pattern of:
PLAY - SKIP - PLAY - SKIP - PLAY - SKIP - PLAY


Then all you need to do is move the shape up to the right (like you did with your right hand) to the next white key, and you will be able to play through the diatonic 7 chords in the key of $C$.

Have a go at playing through the chords now with your left hand.
