Add Warmth to an Element

Quickly give an autumn touch to an element by adjusting the color balance to warm it up.

Quick Tips for Adding Warmth to an Element:

- Duplicate any element to protect the original. In the Menu Bar, choose Image > Duplicate to create a copy. In the dialog box, click OK.
- To add warmth to an element, in the Menu Bar, choose Filter > Camera Raw Filter.
- In the dialog box, click to open the Color panel and drag the Temperature slider to the right until the element warms up to your liking.
- Click and drag the Tint slider to the right if additional changes are needed.
- Click OK to close the Camera Raw Filter dialog box.

Will this work on all elements?

- Technically, yes. You can use this technique on any element.
- But, not all elements need warming up.
- Elements that have a very cool temperature, (deep blues and purples) will not work well.
- The white areas will look yellow so try to avoid white elements or elements with white in them.
