Mismatch with the journal's scope



Find a suitable target journal for your manuscript!

Lack of originality, novelty, or significance



Ensure your results are generalizable and/or have practical, clinical, or theoretical implications



Flaws in study design, poorly formulated research question



Do a thorough literature review to choose the best research metholody

Follow the IMRAD format to prepare a well-structured manuscript

Language and spelling issues



Avoid jargon, write simply and clearly, run a spell check



Poorly presented visual elements



Ensure the figures, tables, images, and graphs are accurate and clearly

Unintentional ethical issues, e.g., plagiarism



Avoid plagiarism - follow all ethical publishing guidelines

Lack of adherence to journal submission guidelines



Read, understand, and follow ALL manuscript submission guidelines

Manuscripts could also be rejected for reasons not related to quality, e.g., space constraints; quality, experience, and availability of peer reviewers; volume of submissions; journal decision-making policy; multiple submissions on the same topic, etc.
