HOW TO CHOOSE APOSTOLIC TEAM MEMBERS

INTRODUCTION

- It is not <u>easy</u>. Three things are <u>essential</u>: prayer care time
- A mistake in this area can destroy a life-time of ministry.
 - Proverbs 16:2 (Amp)
 - I Corinthians 4:5 (NIV)
- CRITERIA FOR CHOOSING

I. <u>Prayer</u>

- A. We must hear the voice of God in our choice.
 - 1. Only God can see the heart I Samuel 16:7; John 2:25; I Corinthians 4:5
 - 2. Prayer is a time to <u>wait</u> on God to reveal the motives and intentions of people.
- B. Jesus Prayed
 - 1. Luke 6:12-13 (NLT)
 - 2. Jesus was never in haste in His choice. Matthew 12:1-5
 - a. Commanded is *diatasso*.
 - b. Matthew 11:1 shows how important this was for Jesus.
- C. Jesus Chose people by the <u>Spirit</u>, not the flesh.

- **II.** Choose by the Spirit and Not in a Time of Stress.
 - A. I Chronicles 12:16-18
 - B. Compare Numbers 11:14-17
 - 1. Moses was stressed out.
 - a. He simply gathered the 70 that the people chose.
 - b. Numbers 11:24
 - 2. David questioned those who came to him and got a <u>commitment</u> from them.
 - C. Eventually, David's Team brought him to his full destiny and helped to keep him there.
 - You will never go farther than your staff can take you!
 - D. Moses' 70 Elders all died in the wilderness and kept him from his "promised land" by their murmuring and disloyalty.

III. Know Your Apostolic Team Members.

- A. Numbers 11:16 (Amp)
 - I Thessalonians 5:12a
- B. Know have a <u>relationship</u> with those on your Apostolic Team.
 - 1. Never bring someone onto your team unless you know and are comfortable with him/her.

- 2. Paul knew Timothy's heart.
 - a. Philippians 2:20 "<u>like-minded</u>"
 - b. Philippians 2:22-23
- IV. Every Apostolic Team Member Must Carry Your Heart and Ministry Load.
 - A. Numbers 11:17
 - B. First, they must have your <u>spirit</u> your anointing, complimentary gifts.
 - C. Second, they must have your <u>heart</u> your vision, passion, attitude.
 - God can give them your anointing; <u>you</u> must give them your heart.
 - D. Third, they must be willing to <u>bear</u> the burden and <u>share</u> the load.
