Adjectives with prepositions

Some adjectives are followed by a particular preposition (when used with the verb be). Sometimes a different preposition is used depending on whether you are referring to 'people' or 'things'. You can check this in a dictionary, but they include:

angry/annoyed/happy/upset about (things) good/bad at late/famous/ready for different from interested in afraid/fond/frightened of keen on kind/married/used to angry/annoyed/bored with (people)

When you use the verb after the preposition, you use the verb + -ing form.

He's keen on playing football.
I'm interested in learning about other cultures.

When you learn new adjectives which are followed by prepositions, try to learn the adjective and the preposition together.
