Benefit

is stated in the contract?

Has something of value been given, paid for, allowed, or offered that was not in the contract?



Gambling and lottery laws?

Is there a raffle, lottery, or other game of chance involved? If so, state gambling and lottery laws must also be taken into consideration.



If the answer is yes, then chances are it would be considered an inducement or rebate.
