# Collage with an Iron

## 4 Week Class- Focus will be on creating a palette of collage papers from magazines only and fusing it to watercolor paper using polymer medium and an iron.

<u>Materials needed</u>: Golden's polymer medium or Nova Color artist acrylic medium #233, acrylic paints, 140 lb. (hot or cold) watercolor paper, newspapers, wax paper, stencils, sandpaper, flat paint brush, small detail paint brush, scissors, ruler, pencil, house iron or tack iron, safety release paper. (Optional Fineline Precision applicator)

Magazine Collage Fused with an iron

This online class will have us jumping directly into to collaging with an iron. We will use magazine pages only as our paper source. Altering and sanding the surface with stencils to create interesting new textures, to building a palette to work from. Coating of the papers will be done to create a layer that will be fused together with your own house iron or a tack iron. Small exercises will be done first for a gentle warm up leading to a larger collage on a substrate of 140 lb. Watercolor paper. 
