Flying through the Sky

Imagine sitting on your couch on a cool November evening. You are about to concentrate on your favorite book. It takes a little focus because it is a mystery. Just as you get comfortable, BAM! A softball sized meteor smashes through your roof.

This may not be an issue for most people. It was a problem that happened to Ann Hodges in her house in Alabama. One November 30, 1954, Ann became the first person to be hit by a meteor. The piece of rock that weighed about 8 pounds struck her in the side. Ann's side had a large bruise. She was confused and didn't know what happened, so she called the police and the fire department.

Scientists found another piece of the meteor that hit Ann. They decided

to store that piece in the Smithsonian's National Museum of Natural History. They chose to do this, so it can be viewed by anyone who wants to see it.

Ann Hodges is the first person to ever be hit by a meteor. Some may say she had bad luck. Next time you curl up on your couch, think about her adventure.
