ALLITERATION

- Repeating consonant sounds/letters, usually at the beginning of words.
- Effects: memorable, stand out.

"The <u>spade sinks</u> into the <u>gravelly ground</u>" <i>Digging, Seamus Heaney

Spade sinks - ss sound (sibilance), evokes the idea of a spade sinking into the ground. **Gravelly ground** - gr is a more harsh, grainy sound, rough texture of the ground.

"<u>Bullets</u> smacking the <u>belly</u> out of the air" Bayonet Charge, Ted Hughes

Bullets / **belly** - 'b' plosive, harsh, violent, heavy sound - emphasises the violence of the scene and creates a sense of brutality.

"<u>Summer, and the long grass</u> is a <u>snare drum</u>" *The Field Mouse*, Gillian Clarke

Summer > grass > snare - connects these images together. Long grass - continued 'g' sound emulates the image of tall/long blades of grass.
