## **MARK SCHEME**

## Extended Hunter Questions

Marking is somewhat open to interpretation. Marks should be given to reasonably similar ideas and presentation to the examples below, with appropriate evidence. Deduct marks for missing/inaccurate evidence and poor presentation/structure.

- a) The news story took place in, 'London's Trafalgar Square.'(1)
- b) Onlookers thought the pigeon was trying to steal food (1), shown by the phrase, "at first, we thought it just wanted some pizza crust."(1)
- c) The witness' name was 'Sally Cranston'. (1)
- d) The writer calls the pigeon the following names: "Feathered ninja"(1), "beaky botherer"(1), "winged warrior"(1) and "plucky pigeon."(1)
- e) The pigeon splashed water on the man which made him cough.(1) "Drop the cold water straight into the face of a homeless man."(1) This made the crowds notice him and drew attention to the fact he was poorly.(1)
- f) The homeless man was poorly/ill/unwell (1). The passage says he had suffered a "heart attack."(1)
- g) Four verbs to describe the actions of the pigeon are, "swerving"(1), "flapping"(1), "plucked"(1) and "soar"(1). (Also accept "carried"/"drop"/"saved")
