- 2. Identify the triad (20)
- 3. Build the triad (16)
- 4. Play this chord progression (7)
- 5. Identify the chords in this chord progression (5)
- 6. Use your ear to determine the chord quality (16)

Total Test = 68 questions

Part 2 — Identify the triad

- 1. I'm going to play 20 different triads and it's your job to identify exactly which triad it is. Identify the inversion and quality. For example: "This is a Cm 1st inversion".
- 2. Write your answers down on paper. If you're taking the test live, just say what the fookin' triads are on camera.

Part 3 — Build the triad

Build the following 4 triads with bass notes on the E string:

- 1. $B_{P}m 2^{nd}$ inversion
- 2. D 1^{st} inversion
- 3. Csus4 root position
- 4. Bsus2 1st inversion

Build the following 4 triads with bass notes on the A string:

- 1. G+ 1st inversion
- 2. $E > 2^{nd}$ inversion
- 3. Fm root position
- 4. Asus2 2nd inversion

Build the following 4 triads with bass notes on the D string:

- 1. G° 2nd inversion
- 2. B_{\flat} root position
- 3. Fm 2nd inversion
- 4. Esus4 2nd inversion

Build the following 4 triads with bass notes on the G string:

- 1. $C 2^{nd}$ inversion
- 2. Em 1^{st} inversion
- 3. $E_{\flat}^{\circ} 1^{st}$ inversion
- 4. Bsus4 2nd inversion

Part 4 — Play this chord progression

- Play triads with bass notes on the E string: (Key of C) C, Am, G, Am
- A string: (Key of D) D, Asus4, A, Asus2 (Key of E♭) A♭, Fm, Cm, B♭
- D string: (Key of E) E, D#°, Esus4, F#m (Key of F) F, Dm, C, E°
- G string: (Key of A) E A G^{#°}, F[#]m (Key of G) G, Am, C, Bm

Part 5— Identify the chords
