

- [Instructor] Now we're really gonna see our pop-up in action. If you're following along in the exercise files I'm in the 02_03_start file. The pop-up is in the empty state. So if I go here and select it in the Object States, there's the pop-up that we've been working on. Go back to the empty state so we can see everything on the page. I'm gonna select this group down here. This is meant to be a thumbnail image that then triggers the pop-up and plays the video. So let's go to the Buttons and Forms panel.

I'm gonna change this into a button and I'll give it a name that's easier for me to keep track of like thumb_btn, something like that and I'll click the plus sign next to the actions and go down to Go To State. I wanna have the pop-up go to the pop-up state.

Additionally, I want the video to start playing as soon as we go to that state so I'm gonna add another action. I'll click the plus sign and go down to Video and there's the video already selected and it's gonna play. With all that in place I can save my document. Go up to the in5 menu and choose Export HTML5 with in5...

We're just gonna quickly highlight some of the settings that I have for this document. Slider as the Page Format. Under Advanced I've got it set to High Definition because I'm also using Desktop Scaling both for desktop and mobile so it'll fit into the window nicely whatever size it is.

Now that I'm ready to export I'm gonna click OK and then I'll click to view in the browser. Here's my final document in the browser. I'll go to the thumbnail and click on it. The pop-up loads up and plays the time lapse video. And then when I click on the X it closes the video. There, we've got a working video pop-up. So one of the things that you could do with this document now, you could add more styling, a rollover for this thumbnail button. In the next chapter we're gonna take a look at creating a multi-video pop-up.

So let's get started with that.
