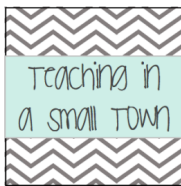

Look carefully at your list of words. On the back of this page, make a list of word families that have silent letters. Then see if you can think of other words that fit into each word family.

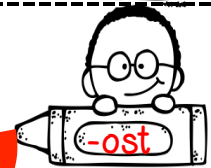
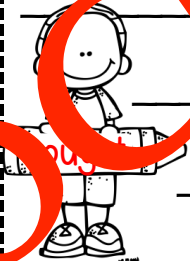
"The Many Spellings of /aw/"

What To Do:

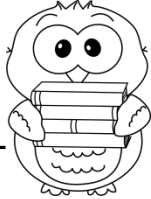
