These verbs certainly are the most common ones in the language. They have a tricky conjugation but must be learned by heart, as well as a minimum of structures (check next lesson for more).

DETAILS

Avoir and être are also auxiliaries used to form other tenses so, you better buckle up, because you'll be using those all the time.

 \hat{E} tre = to be

Je suis

Tu es

II, elle, on est

Nous sommes

Vous êtes

Ils, elles sont

Avoir = to have

J'ai

Tu as

II, elle, on a

Nous avons

Vous avez

Ils, elles ont

=> Make sure to pronounce "ils / elles ss sont" and "ils / elles z ont". Check the recordings.

USE IT

Être + characteristics of personalities, physical description

Avoir + item owned

Examples:

Je suis une fille. = I am a girl.

Nous avons une maison. = We have a house.
