Section 1 – Getting Started

The first section is all about getting the basics down so that we can start to truly fingerpick in section two.

If you are a complete beginner, then that's great. This section will give you some of the basics; we will learn the string names, learn three chords, make sure that you can read guitar tablature, understand chord charts and play along to a metronome. I provide some helpful links to make sure your guitar is tuned. You only need three chords for section 2 but I show you another three to have at your disposal. I show you how to change chords quickly and to play them in time.

If you have played some guitar before, that's really great and you will have a bit of a head start and probably be quicker to pick up some of the things that are taught. Feel free to watch the videos; which only take a few minutes each to see if you are missing any of the basics, but your work will start in section 2.

Section 2 – Fingerpicking Basics

In the second section, we really get fingerpicking. I help you to understand the background to how fingerpicking works and which fingers play which strings. We learn two different notations, learn several fingerpicking patterns and finish up by learning some fingerpicking in the style of REM.

Section 3 – The Thumb

The real beauty of fingerpicking is that it sounds like there are two guitars playing. Listen to the piece I play in the introduction video. The key to getting that sound is for our thumb to do the work of the bass player and then our fingers to play some nice melodies at the same time. We start to master the thumb in section 3 and the fingers in section 4. In this section we play alternating bass and walking bass examples, we add more fingerpicking patterns and I give you a cheat sheet so you can always figure out which bass notes to play over every chord.
