



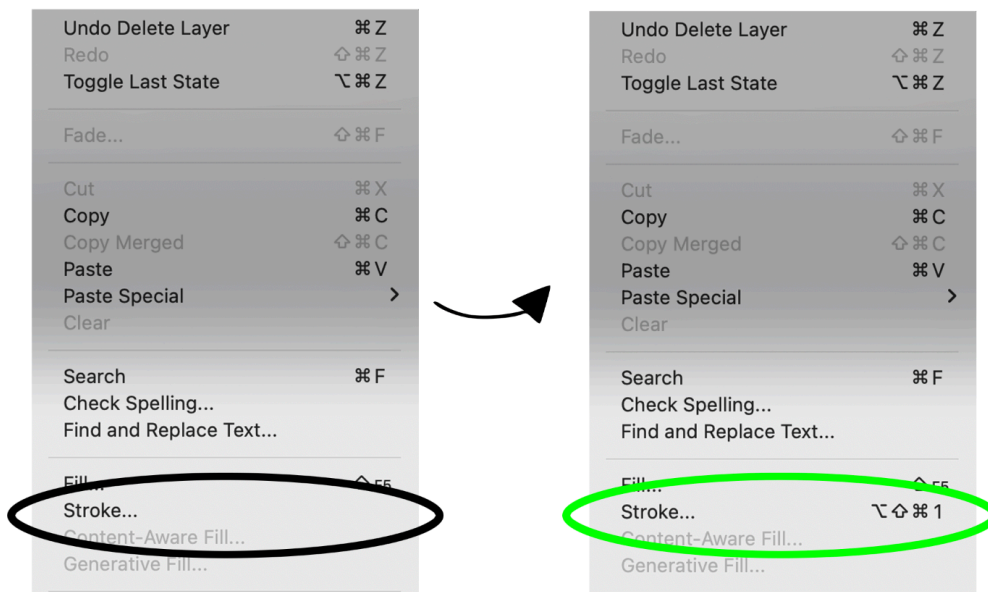

Quick Tips for Creating a Custom Keyboard Shortcut:

- In the Menu Bar, choose Edit > Keyboard Shortcuts to access the Keyboard Shortcuts dialog box.
- At the top of the dialog box, make sure it's set to Keyboard Shortcuts and not Menus.
- Set the Shortcuts For dropdown box to the appropriate option you wish to create a shortcut for. To create a shortcut for the Edit > Stroke dialog box, select Application Menus for this dropdown box.
- Click to toggle open the appropriate Command option. To create a shortcut for the Edit > Stroke dialog box, click to toggle open the Edit Menu Command.
- Scroll down (if necessary) until you locate the command you wish to create a shortcut for. To create a shortcut for the Stroke dialog box, locate the word Stroke.
- Click on the command you wish to create a shortcut for. To create a shortcut for the Stroke dialog box, click on the word Stroke to see a box appear for typing in a keyboard shortcut.
- Once you type in a shortcut that isn't already in use, click Accept to assign it to that command. To create the same keyboard shortcut for the Edit > Stroke dialog box as used in the video, type in the shortcut of Shift Alt Ctrl 1 (Mac: Shift Opt Cmd 1) and click Accept.
- Click OK to close the dialog box.

Things to Remember When Creating a Custom Keyboard Shortcut:

- Picking a keyboard shortcut that isn't already in use may require some trial and error. You may have to enter different shortcut options before something that isn't in use can be accepted.
- Once you find an option that you can use for a keyboard shortcut, you'll also want to make sure it doesn't conflict with the operating system of the computer you have. If your operating system already uses that keyboard shortcut for something else, this could cause you issues or not work how you want in Photoshop.
- There's also the potential for this keyboard shortcut you create to conflict with other applications on your system. So if you have both apps running at the same time, using the keyboard shortcut could cause you to perform a step in the other app instead of Photoshop.
- However, if the shortcut you create does give you problems with the operating system or another application, just change it to something else that doesn't.
- Finally, this keyboard shortcut menu gives you the power to change the keyboard shortcuts already assigned in PS. I highly recommend that you don't change any of the default shortcuts because here at Digital Scrapper, if we give you a step that uses a keyboard shortcut, it will always be the default one.
