# THE BEAT SHEET

#### What Is a Beat?

A beat is something that happens in the story and moves the plot forward.

## The beat sheet is a document stating what will happen in the show. Beat by beat.

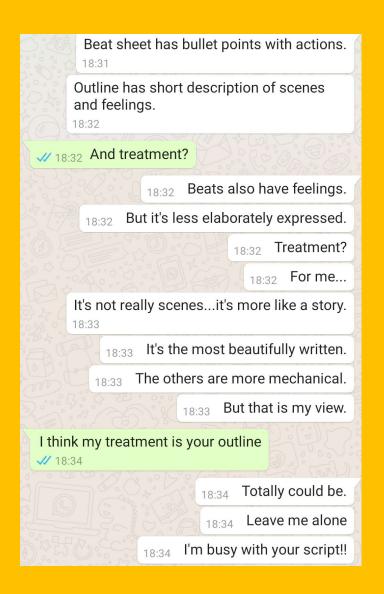
### What's the difference between story events, scenes and beats?

#### **My Process**

**Beat Sheet** (aka outline) - One sentence for each beat.

<u>Treatment</u> - all the scenes, usually more scenes then the beat sheet. elaborated. With the tone of the show, clear relationships. Without dialogue.

Unlike the beat sheet, a treatment is a document producers and broadcasters will read too.



I'd say a beat sheet is where you cronologically flash out the scenes writing them down in short beats. Episode Outline is where you describe what happens in the episode in a text. And treatment can be similar to outline

# Important! Do it YOUR way.

### By now you have -

- Your characters, and their want's and needs.
- Inciting Incident
- Ending.

### Now, you will -

Come up with the beats that will take you from the first scene, to the last.

#### **Case Study –The Ozarks**

- Teaser -Marti dragging cooler in a forest.
- Marti is his office, talking to new clients.
- Lidel, the new office and the Ozark pamphlet.
- Marti watches a video of his wife cheats on him.
- NOT going to a prostitute.
- Bruce calls him get here now.
- Del Finds The Traitor.
- Marti's live is spared But now he HAS TO...
- We need to go!
- Privet detective. Marti knew for a while... Wendy took all the money.
- Things get complicated.
- FBI!
- I have to see that you can do it The stakes are clear.
- The FBI is after Marti too Stakes just got higher. (end)
- Arrive at the Ozarks. (last scene)

#### End-of-Pilot Question: Will Marti get caught?

#### PETTY

Mexicans, Mafia, Muslims. We all want these people to be more than they are. They're not. They're just a product of their options. If they weren't dealing drugs, extorting businesses or flying planes into buildings they'd be cleaning toilets. These aren't criminal geniuses, agent. #### **Case Study –The Ozarks**

- Old life Accountant in Chicago, wife cheating on him.
- Inciting incident Del finds the traitor.
- New life Laundry money in the Ozarks to save his life.
- Ending Del is not the only threat. The FBI are looking for him as well.

#### How to come up with good beats?

- 1. Research.
- 2. Trail and Error.
- 3. Write everything you got > leave empty space for the missing beat.
- 4. Go from the end to the beginning.
- 5. Remember: Cause and effect.
- 6. Ask: what is the worse thing that could happen to the character. Use it.
- 7. Ask: what is the worse decision/action your character can take, and why. Use it.
- 8. Are you saving something amazing for the next episode/season? Use it. Now.

#### What to do if you get stuck?

- 1. Write 10 bad ideas. Didn't help? Write 20.
- Take a break Play/walk/cook/Read/paint.
- 3. Pomodoro Write for 20 minutes.
- 4. Call/write a friend Think out load.
- 5. Try writing the beats for one character.
- 6. Try writing the beats for one plot.
- 7. Can't look at the laptop no more? Use a notebook. Doesn't work? Try recording yourself.
- 8. Meditate. (It's magic!)
