NOTE: In Spanish the verb forms often make clear who the subject of the sentence is and are usually unnecessary and omitted.

No

I said no.

He dicho que no

I-have said that no.



Not

No

She is not at home.

Ella no está en casa

She not is in house.



Question marker "do"

Do you speak English?

¿Hablas Inglés?

(You)-speak English?



To be (permanent)

Ser

To be or not to be?

Ser o no ser?

To-be or not to-be?

NOTE: The verb 'ser' is used for permanent or lasting characteristics that usually don't change over time. E.g.: "Yo soy español" (I am Spanish).; "Yo soy profesor" (I am a teacher).



To be (now)

Estar

Are you busy now?

ું Estás ocupado ahora?

You-are busy now?

NOTE: The verb 'estar' is used to emphasize a temporary state or location. E.g.: "¿Dónde está el baño?" (Where is the bathroom?); "¿Estás cansado?"; (Are you tired?)



I am

Yo soy

I am Spanish.

Soy español.

(I)-am Spanish.

NOTE: ♀: (Yo) soy Española.



You are

Tú eres

Are you English?

¿Eres inglés?

(You)-are English?

NOTE: ♀: ¿(Tú) eres Inglésa?



And

You and I.

Tú y yo

You and I.



And -not

I don't know and I don't want to know.

Not it I-know and not it I-want to-know.



To be called

What's your name?

How yourself you-call?



To speak

Hablar

What languages do you speak?

¿Qué idioma hablas?

What language you-speak?



English


Inglés
