The lyrics to this lovely popular song from Switzer-land are by Antonia Ridge and the music is by Frederick Moeller. It made our American Hit Parade on a recording sung by a children's chorus and is being used here with permission. The added descant part is sung separately on the tape for quick learning and should be practiced many times before being sung with the regular chorus.

Perhaps the necessary breathing places are obvious, but take care not to breathe in the middle of a word or in the middle of a long note.

Make the "l" on the word "la" very quickly by using only the tongue without the jaw. Also, when singing "ha," be sure not to use too much of the breathy "h" sound. It uses air too quickly and you might run short, since there is not time to take another breath between the last "ha" and the word that follows.

Feel free to change the key of this song if there are notes that are too low or too high to sing in your comfort range.

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
