

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
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"But remember, to understand light, we do need to realize we live in a dark world."

Why is understanding "light" so important?

One answer may be obvious: because we live in a dark world.

This course is called "Come to the Light" and will be a salve to those of us who find ourselves in the dark, confusing world where it seems that, culturally, everything is falling apart. This course will help lead us to understanding how, even in this darkness, we are called to live as a believer or true light in this world. To do this, we must first recognize there is a spiritual dimension to our life. We don't just live in the natural. And behind that spiritual dimension is the battle between the light, the true life of God in the Spirit, and the darkness, which is the life of the enemy, the satanic and demonic.

Once we understand this, we are quickly able to discern what is true, what is light, and what is coming from God—His wisdom will never be confused with the darkness. This course will take us into the depth of this and will reveal discernment, truth, light, and how we are to be led into the abundant life that God has for us.

But remember, to understand light, we do need to realize we live in a dark world.

In John 10:10, we see a description of the enemy. Describe the enemy's nature as revealed here. How does this impact the world we live in, and why this is important to understand regarding our life?

Read John 10:10:
10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.

What does this imply about the paths in the world that we walk? Why is this so significant for us?

Read Proverbs 2:13:
¹³ who forsake the paths of uprightness
to walk in the ways of darkness,
to wark in the ways of darkness,

Read Proverbs 4:19:
10
¹⁹ The way of the wicked is like deep darkness;

What do these verses tell us about the difference between the wisdom of the
world and the wisdom from God. What does this then imply about the world? Why
is this so important for us to understand?
Read James 3:13–18:

Wisdom from Above

¹³ Who is wise and understanding among you? By his good conduct let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom. ¹⁴ But if you have bitter jealousy

and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. ¹⁵ This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. ¹⁶ For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice. ¹⁷ But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere. ¹⁸ And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.

Second: What is the significance of "light?" It is the only way to the promised abundant life. What does this say about the primary characteristic of light? Why is this so important to our life?
Read Ecclesiastes 2:13: 13 Then I saw that there is more gain in wisdom than in folly, as there is more gain in light than in darkness.

How does John describe the light? What is the power over darkness? What does this mean in our lives?

Read John 1:1–9:
The Word Became Flesh 1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. ⁴ In him was
life ^[a] and the life was the light of men. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.
⁶ There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. ⁸ He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.
⁹ The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world.
What does Christ, the Light, promise those of us who follow Him? What does this mean about how we will experience life with Him?
Read John 10:10:
¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.

1. What is "light?"

How does Christ describe Himself? What does this mean, and why is this important to our lives?

I Am the Light of the World 12 Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." Thrist is the light – "I AM the Light of Life!" In these verses, what are some of the characteristics of light? How will they be impactful in our everyday lives? Read Daniel 5:11–12: 11 There is a man in your kingdom in whom is the spirit of the holy gods. In the days of your father, light and understanding and wisdom like the wisdom of the gods were found in him, and King Nebuchadnezzar, your father—your father the king—made him chief of the magicians, enchanters, Chaldeans, and astrologers, 12 because an excellent spirit, knowledge, and understanding to interpret dreams, explain riddles, and solve problems were found in this Daniel, whom the king named Belteshazzar. Now let Daniel be called, and he will show the interpretation."		
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In order for us to experience the light, what is necessary that we understand about the light? How do we live this out so that we receive the power of the light?

Read 1 Timothy 6:13-16:

¹³ I charge you in the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before^[a] Pontius Pilate made the good confession,¹⁴ to keep the commandment unstained and free from reproach until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ, ¹⁵ which he will display at the proper time—he who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords,¹⁶ who alone has immortality, who dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see. To him be honor and eternal dominion. Amen.

In this story of Jesus appearing before Pilate, what did Paul want us to understand about Christ being King of kings? What did Jesus say that was so important that we need to receive? What does this look like in our everyday lives?

Read John 18:18-38:

¹⁸ Now the servants^[a] and officers had made a charcoal fire, because it was cold, and they were standing and warming themselves. Peter also was with them, standing and warming himself.

The High Priest Questions Jesus

¹⁹ The high priest then questioned Jesus about his disciples and his teaching.²⁰ Jesus answered him, "I have spoken openly to the world. I have always taught in synagogues and in the temple, where all Jews come together. I have said nothing in secret. ²¹ Why do you ask me? Ask those who have heard me what I said to them; they know what I said." ²² When he had said these things, one of the officers standing by struck Jesus with his hand, saying, "Is that how you answer the high priest?" ²³ Jesus answered him, "If what I said is wrong,

bear witness about the wrong; but if what I said is right, why do you strike me?"²⁴ Annas then sent him bound to Caiaphas the high priest.

Peter Denies Jesus Again

²⁵ Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself. So they said to him, "You also are not one of his disciples, are you?" He denied it and said, "I am not." One of the servants of the high priest, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, asked, "Did I not see you in the garden with him?" ²⁷ Peter again denied it, and at once a rooster crowed.

Jesus Before Pilate

²⁸ Then they led Jesus from the house of Caiaphas to the governor's headquarters. ^[b] It was early morning. They themselves did not enter the governor's headquarters, so that they would not be defiled, but could eat the Passover. ²⁹ So Pilate went outside to them and said, "What accusation do you bring against this man?" ³⁰ They answered him, "If this man were not doing evil, we would not have delivered him over to you." ³¹ Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and judge him by your own law." The Jews said to him, "It is not lawful for us to put anyone to death." ³² This was to fulfill the word that Jesus had spoken to show by what kind of death he was going to die.

My Kingdom Is Not of This World

³³ So Pilate entered his headquarters again and called Jesus and said to him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" ³⁴ Jesus answered, "Do you say this of your own accord, or did others say it to you about me?" ³⁵ Pilate answered, "Am I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests have delivered you over to me. What have you done?" ³⁶ Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world." ³⁷ Then Pilate said to him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this purpose I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice." ³⁸ Pilate said to him, "What is truth?"

After he had said this, he went back outside to the Jews and told them, "I find no guilt in him.

What does this tell us about light and dark? How important is this to how we live? What exactly does this practically mean in our everyday lives?
Read 2 Corinthians 6:14–18:
The Temple of the Living God 14 Do not be unequally yoked with unbelievers. For what partnership has righteousness with lawlessness? Or what fellowship has light with darkness? What accord has Christ with Belial? Or what portion does a believer share with an unbeliever? What agreement has the temple of God with idols? For we are the temple of the living God; as God said, "I will make my dwelling among them and walk among them, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. 17 Therefore go out from their midst, and be separate from them, says the Lord, and touch no unclean thing; then I will welcome you, 18 and I will be a father to you, and you shall be sons and daughters to me, says the Lord Almighty."

What do these verses (which we do understand about the wonderful work of Christ for us) say about the difference between evil and light? Thus, what is the key for us to pursue in all aspects of our lives? What does that look like?

Read John 3:16–21:
For God So Loved the World ¹⁶ "For God so loved the world, ^[a] that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. ¹⁸ Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. ¹⁹ And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. ²⁰ For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his works should be exposed. ²¹ But whoever does what is true comes to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that his works have been carried out in God."

What does the "Light" provide for His children?

What does the Light lead us to? What happens there, and why is that so beneficial to us?

Read Psalm 43:3-4:

 ³ Send out your light and your truth; let them lead me;
 let them bring me to your holy hill and to your dwelling!
 ⁴ Then I will go to the altar of God, to God my exceeding joy,
 and I will praise you with the lyre,
 O God, my God.

What do these verses promise are the benefits of walking in the light? Why are they so meaningful to us and our lives?

Read Psalm 4:6–8:

If you take away the yoke from your midst,

As you live in the light, what do you become? Why is that a wonderful benefit to you and to others? What does that look like in your life?

Read Isaiah 42:6-9:

6"I am the Lord; I have called you[a] in righteousness;
I will take you by the hand and keep you;
I will give you as a covenant for the people,
a light for the nations,

to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.

⁸ I am the Lord; that is my name; my glory I give to no other,

nor my praise to carved idols. ⁹ Behold, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth I tell you of them."

What does Christ speak here about receiving things in private? Why is this important, and what benefit will we accrue?	_
Read Matthew 10:27–31: 27 What I tell you in the dark, say in the light, and what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. 28 And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. [a] 29 Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? [b] And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. 30 But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. 31 Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows.	
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Our role is very clear and necessary to experience benefits.

Key principles:

What does it mean to "work out your own salvation"? How do we do that, and how does it relate to following God and living in the light? What practically does that mean to us?

Read Philippians 2:12–15: Lights in the World 12 Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, 13 for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure. 14 Do all things without grumbling or disputing, 15 that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,

With this description of the oil and the lamp, what is the spiritual principle that is important for us to understand? What does that mean for each of us personally?

Read Exodus 27:20-21; 35:4-9, 27-29:

Oil for the Lamp

²⁰ "You shall command the people of Israel that they bring to you pure beaten olive oil for the light, that a lamp may regularly be set up to burn. ²¹ In the tent of meeting, outside the veil that is before the testimony, Aaron and his sons shall tend it from evening to morning before the Lord. It shall be a statute forever to be observed throughout their generations by the people of Israel.

Contributions for the Tabernacle 4 Moses said to all the congregation of the people of Israel, "This is the thing that the Lord has commanded. 5 Take from among you a contribution to the Lord. Whoever is of a generous heart, let him bring the Lord's contribution: gold, silver, and bronze; 6 blue and purple and scarlet yarns and fine twined linen; goats' hair, 7 tanned rams' skins, and goatskins; acacia wood, 8 oil for the light, spices for the anointing oil and for the fragrant incense, 9 and onyx stones and stones for setting, for the ephod and for the breastpiece. 27 And the leaders brought onyx stones and stones to be set, for the ephod and for the breastpiece, 28 and spices and oil for the light, and for the anointing oil, and for the fragrant incense. 29 All the men and women, the people of Israel, whose heart moved them to bring anything for the work that the Lord had commanded by Moses to be done brought it as a free will offering to the Lord.
If we are walking in the light, who must we know, experience, and follow? Why is this important, particularly versus studying about the light? What is the difference, and what difference will it mean in our life?
Read John 1:6–9:
⁶ There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. ⁸ He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light. ⁹ The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world.

What does John say about our role with the light, and what we are to pursue and enjoy? Why? What does this look like in our personal lives?

Read John 3:22–36:
John the Baptist Exalts Christ ²² After this Jesus and his disciples went into the Judean countryside, and he remained there with them and was baptizing. ²³ John also was baptizing at Aenon near Salim, because water was plentiful there, and people were coming and being baptized ²⁴ (for John had not yet been put in prison).
²⁵ Now a discussion arose between some of John's disciples and a Jew over purification. ²⁶ And they came to John and said to him, "Rabbi, he who was with you across the Jordan, to whom you bore witness—look, he is baptizing, and all are going to him." ²⁷ John answered, "A person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven. ²⁸ You yourselves bear me witness, that I said, 'I am not the Christ, but I have been sent before him.' ²⁹ The one who has the bride is the bridegroom. The friend of the bridegroom, who stands and hears him, rejoices greatly at the bridegroom's voice. Therefore this joy of mine is now complete. ³⁰ He must increase, but I must decrease." ^[a]
³¹ He who comes from above is above all. He who is of the earth belongs to the earth and speaks in an earthly way. He who comes from heaven is above all. ³² He bears witness to what he has seen and heard, yet no one receives his testimony. ³³ Whoever receives his testimony sets his seal to this, that God is true. ³⁴ For he whom God has sent utters the words of God, for he gives the Spirit without measure. ³⁵ The Father loves the Son and has given all things into his hand. ³⁶ Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him.

Delight in Him – Abide:

What does it mean to delight in Him? As we do delight in Him, what does He promise? What does that mean to us personally?

Read Psalm 37:1-8:

He Will Not Forsake His Saints

[a] Of David.

- **37** Fret not yourself because of evildoers; be not envious of wrongdoers!
- ² For they will soon fade like the grass and wither like the green herb.
- ³ Trust in the Lord, and do good; dwell in the land and befriend faithfulness.^[b]
- ⁴ Delight yourself in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart.
- ⁵ Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him, and he will act.
- ⁶ He will bring forth your righteousness as the light, and your justice as the noonday.
- ⁷ Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him; fret not yourself over the one who prospers in his way, over the man who carries out evil devices!
- 8 Refrain from anger, and forsake wrath! Fret not yourself; it tends only to evil.

What has Christ done regarding how we are placed in the light? What does that mean, and what is important for us to follow if we are to experience this? On what basis will we experience this?

Read Colossians 1:9-18:

⁹ And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, ¹⁰ so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him: bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God;¹¹ being strengthened with all power, according to his glorious might, for all endurance and patience with joy; ¹² giving thanks^[a] to the Father, who has qualified you^[b] to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. ¹³ He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, ¹⁴ in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

The Preeminence of Christ

¹⁵ He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. ¹⁶ For by^[c] him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. ¹⁷ And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸ And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent.

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All things were created by Him, and for Him. Thus, the material is subordinate to the spiritual.

This world was created by Him speaking it (called Ex-nihilo) out of nothing. The material, the physical, all things literally were created by Him and for Him through Him speaking; this is the spiritual. He is above all things, because He is superior to all things. And there's nothing that is beyond His ability to influence, create

Read Mark 4:21-25 and Luke 8:16-18:

A Lamp Under a Basket

²¹ And he said to them, "Is a lamp brought in to be put under a basket, or under a bed, and not on a stand? ²² For nothing is hidden except to be made manifest; nor is anything secret except to come to light. ²³ If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear." ²⁴ And he said to them, "Pay attention to what you hear: with the measure you use, it will be measured to you, and still more will be added to you. ²⁵ For to the one who has, more will be given, and from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away."

Walk in the Light:

What does this speak to about what is important to walking in the light? Why? What does that mean as we consider our life right now as we are to walk in light?

Read Ephesians 5:8-14:

⁸ for at one time you were darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light ⁹ (for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true), ¹⁰ and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord. ¹¹ Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. ¹² For it is shameful even to speak of the things that they do in secret. ¹³ But when anything is exposed by the light, it becomes visible, ¹⁴ for anything that becomes visible is light. Therefore it says,

"Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you."

To walk in the light, what is Christ's simple instruction to us? What does this truly mean, and how do we carry this out?

Read John 8:12:

I Am the Light of the World

¹² Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world.

²⁴ "No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.^[a]

We are not of the night or of the darkness. ⁶ So then let us not sleep, as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober. ⁷ For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, are drunk
