

String Family

There are 4 main stringed instruments in the orchestra. Here they are in size order from smallest to largest: violin, viola, cello, and double bass. We will also learn about the harp in this pack.

(Instruments such as guitars and mandolins are also stringed instruments, but we will study them in another lesson. The piano also has strings, but is often considered a keyboard or a percussion instrument. We will study keyboard instruments in another lesson as well.)
