### **Scraping with Filters, Stamp & Paint**

Challenge 2: Paper Challenge (Part 1)

#### TRANSCRIPT

Use the provided striped paper to create a stamp and paint image, then use the image you created on a card or scrapbook page. Welcome to Challenge 2, the paper challenge. In this challenge I'm asking you to open this striped paper from the class downloads. Use the same instructions from Section 1 of this class showing you how to apply the Stamp filter, apply the Palette Knife filter, paint in color, and then mask away boundary lines. For your reference, here's my completed stamp in paint stripes. See how close you can come to duplicating the image that I have here. This image is included in the manual for this video so that you can reference it as you work. Here are a few things about my finished image that make it look more artsy and pretty.

Notice that I only used a small portion of the entire striped paper. I chose to form a long and somewhat rectangular image, but really any shape whatsoever could be achieved. Also take note that when painting the stripes back in, I varied the lengths of the stripes. I also varied the length of the boundary lines and made sure they extended past the painted area. Doing this gives my stamp and paint design much more character.

When you're finished with the stamp and paint technique, take the challenge a bit farther by placing your stamped and colored image on a 7x5 greeting card using the paper and word art from the class downloads. Once you finish your design, move on to part two of this challenge to see step-by-step how I created the look from my paper. This challenge is sure to inspire some fun.
