

In previous lessons, I've demonstrated two other ways to share HTML output from in5 with others.

But I've saved the best for last. Tiiny host is a fantastic low-cost service that takes the headache out of sharing wire frames and other websites in progress with stakeholders. Tiiny host is all about removing friction from sharing web projects with others. They make it extremely simple to create a folder, put the files in that folder and share a URL to the content.

It's specifically designed for temporary work-in-progress websites, and sharing those sites with others for review. Here's how it works.

First, you create a zip file of your in5 output. Then visit tiiny.host with a browser and log in. Then, just click this upload button, upload your zip file, give it a name and you're done.

This is the URL that you'll share with your stakeholders. It couldn't be easier. If you need to update the site later, just come in here, click update, and then upload a new zip file. If you have frequent need to share websites with others for review and approval, Tiiny host makes this as easy as possible.
