



## **What You Need**

1, 12 -24 pan watercolor set. I prefer Rembrandt but any artist quality brand is fine.

1 round brush such as a #6 or #8 or a dagger brush. There are travel brushes where the handle becomes the cap such as The Silver Brush Black Velvet Voyage brushes or Tintoretto that are very nice.

1, 6" x 8" or similar size hardbound watercolor sketch book.

1, permanent black ink pen 1, Posca brush tip white acrylic pen.

A few paper towels and a small, unbreakable water cup, ziplock bag.

The watercolor sketching kits are easy to store in a small kitchen drawer or take with you on the road anywhere in the world.

## **Painting On Location**

Here I am at The Living Desert Zoo and Botanical Gardens in Palm Desert with my watercolor painting of the Australian Kookabura bird, Tarzana.
