1. ADAMANT

Our world is buying the lie that truth is a river, ebbing and flowing with the passage of time. But truth is not a river—it is a rock. And in a world lost in a sea of relativity, we must anchor our souls to the Truth or be drowned in the currents of popular opinion.



1. **The Adamant.** At our core, we want something solid, something steadfast. Over the ages people have searched for truth, hoping to find a sure foundation to build their lives upon. Even Pontius Pilate asked Jesus, “What is truth?” For many this is a hard question—and for far too long, we’ve been willing to leave it unanswered. Fire is the way to test the purity of silver and gold, but the character of a man is tested by giving him a measure of fame. Proverbs 27:21 TPT. 'Hatred is the root of slander and insecurity the root of flattery.' Proverbs 26:28 TPT
2. **Adamantly intimate.** Our identities are often formed through experiences that lied to us and left us with pain. But God is adamantly intimate, able to heal our pain, separate darkness from light, and awaken our true self. When we allow God into the intimate places of our hearts, it sets us free from the lies and false labels we’ve lived under so we can know and experience the truth He speaks over us. It’s better to grab a mad dog by its ears than to meddle and interfere in a quarrel that’s none of your business.' Proverbs 26:17 TPT. 'Don’t respond to the words of a fool with more foolish words, or you will become as foolish as he is! Instead, if you’re asked

a silly question, answer it with words of wisdom so the fool doesn't think he's so clever.' Proverbs 26:4-5 TPT

3. **Adamant in Love and Hate.** God is love, and we are the objects of His greatest and deepest affections. His love for us is invincible. And when we receive God's love, we are positioned to love others the way He loves them. But we cannot champion this love without also knowing hate—more specifically, a hate for anything that unmakes love. A rebellious fool will despise your wise advice, so don't even waste your time—save your breath!' Proverbs 23:9 TPT. 'A gullible person will believe anything, but a sensible person will confirm the facts. A wise person is careful in all things and turns quickly from evil, while the impetuous fool moves ahead with overconfidence. An impulsive person has a short fuse and can ruin everything, but the wise show self-control.' Proverbs 14:15-17 TPT
4. **Adamant in Word and truth.** It is popular to spout opinions, but lasting influence only comes by standing on truth. God's truth never changes, because He is the truth and He never change. In light of this, we should choose our words carefully and not just give voice to popular opinion. As we begin to live the truth, we'll be heard when we speak it. 'Wise men don't divulge all that they know, but chattering fools blurt out words that bring them to the brink of ruin.' Proverbs 10:14 TPT. Hatred keeps old quarrels alive, but love draws a veil over every insult and finds a way to make sin disappear.' Proverbs 10:12 TPT
5. **Adamantly transformed.** The church has often been quick to condemn unbelievers for their sin and behaviour, yet it should be no surprise that people who don't know God act like they don't know God. What we should concern ourselves with, first and foremost, is whether we are living holy and transformed lives. As we pursue the Lord, we can then ask for the wisdom to reveal His kindness to the world around us in a way that invites them to find their own transformation in Him. 'Respond gently when you are confronted and you'll defuse the rage of another. Responding with sharp, cutting words will only make it worse. Don't you know that being angry can ruin the testimony of even the wisest of men?' Proverbs 15:1 TPT. 'God was delighted to give us birth by the truth of his infallible Word so that we would fulfil his chosen destiny for us and become the favourite ones out of all his creation!' James 1:18 TPT
6. **I am adamant.** You are God's adamant. His image, strength, power, and fire are all in you right now, waiting for you to stir them up and grow sure of them. What you do is not merely natural and insignificant—it is spiritual and powerful. You are recreated in Christ to be a soul on fire, revealing His wonder to our world. 'Every believer has received grace gifts, so use them to serve one another as faithful stewards of the many-colored tapestry of God's grace.' 1 Peter 4:10 TPT Stay

away from all the foolish arguments of the immature, for these disputes will only generate more conflict.' 2 Timothy 2:23 TPT

2. BE THAT WOMEN



1. **Timing is everything.** Be that woman who understanding timing
2. **Despite your past.** Like the Samaritan woman, be that woman who presses into the well of living water to eradicate your past.
3. **Free from a life of Sin.** Like the adulterous woman, be that woman who waits for Jesus to speak directly to her.
4. **Nurturing your promise.** Like Elizabeth, be that woman who births promises with wisdom and insight.
5. **According to His Word.** Like the Virgin Mary, be that woman who births promises with strength and faith.

7. **The elephant in the Room.** Like the uninvited woman, leave an impression wherever you go.
8. **Learn to trust in God.** Like Martha, be that woman who runs to Jesus even after He seems to have disappointed you.

9. **Fly into action.** Like Abigail, be that woman who walks in wisdom with what she has.
10. **Honour what God called honourable.** Like Abigail, be that woman who walks in wisdom with what she has.

3. BIBLE MATTERS



1. **Why study the Bible: Part one?** In this lesson, the presenter explains why studying the Bible is essential to discipleship. Without a regular diet of God's Word, our spiritual growth will be stunted. But when we develop the discipline of studying the Scriptures, we'll become spiritually strong and we'll be empowered to obey God.

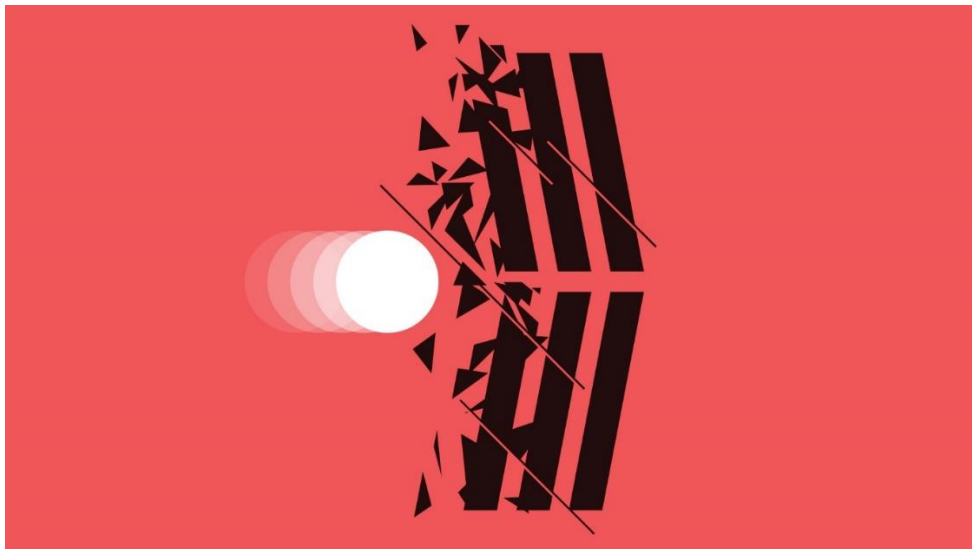
to destroy God's Word—but to no avail. They discuss how history and science actually validate the Bible's authenticity while also providing many more fascinating facts about God's Word.

4.BREAKING INTIMIDATION

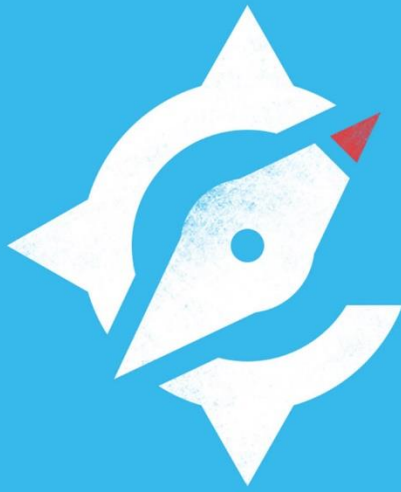


1. **Exposing Intimidation.** You are in a spiritual battle. In this lesson, the presenter explains how countless Christians battle intimidation, yet most wrestle with its effects rather than its source. Intimidation is a spirit and can only be overcome by waging war in the spirit.
2. **Your place of Authority.** You must not only know your place of authority but also function in it. In this lesson, the presenter discusses walking in your God-given authority and how if you don't, the enemy will seek to take it away from you and use it against you.
3. **Dormant gifts.** The objective of intimidation is to restrain you from action. In this lesson, the presenter explains that when you yield to intimidation, you

relinquish your authority, which causes your gift—God’s ability in you—to remain inoperative, leaving you ineffective.

4. **Intimidation is a spirit.** Spiritual resistance requires spiritual assistance. In this lesson, the presenter explains that intimidation is a spirit and can only be defeated by waging war in the spirit, using spiritual weapons. If you attempt to combat intimidation in a natural way, you will only experience temporary relief rather than complete victory.
5. **Paralyzed by Intimidation.** It is easier to not offend the person we see rather than God who we do not see. In this lesson, the presenter explains how an intimidated person honours what they fear more than they honour God. Whether they realize it or not, they offend God by submitting to what intimidates them instead of Him.
6. **Stir up your gift.** Boldness comes from God. In this lesson, the presenter explains how boldness is awakened in the life of a believer when they realize God has given them a spirit of power, love, and soundness of mind. These virtues are necessary to stir up your gift and to boldly confront intimidation.
7. **Root of intimidation.** Motives can be different from outward appearances. In this lesson, the presenter explains that fear and intimidation are rooted in the love of self. He illustrates how God’s love dispels fear and will empower you to lay down your life for Jesus.
8. **Two types of Fear.** You will serve who you fear. In this lesson, the presenter explains that if you fear man more than you fear God, you will become a slave to man. But if you fear God more than man, you’ll obey God even at the rejection or disapproval of man.

5. CALLED



1. **You have a calling.** In this session, the presenter uses Scripture to show that God has given every believer a specific calling. You will understand this truth clearly, empowering you with confidence to learn how to discover, obtain, and fulfil your calling. Challenge: Grab a journal and write down what God speaks to you throughout this course. Your thoughts and dreams become clear when they pass through pencil tips.
2. **The why before the what.** In this lesson, the presenter explains the whys of your specific calling—why it's important to know your calling, why it's important to live in your calling, and why it's important to fulfil your calling. You will discover that knowing your calling brings focus, while living and fulfilling your calling bring great reward. Challenge: Be intentional to spend time in the presence of God, positioning yourself to hear from Him. He wants you to discover your calling, so dedicate time to this process.
3. **The big Picture.** In this session, the presenter revisits the most important reward you can receive for living in your calling—the eternal reward. You will see from Scripture how God does not reward us eternally for simply living a good life; He rewards us when we faithfully live the life, He calls us to live. Challenge: Identify beliefs and fears that would keep you from pursuing your calling. Spend time in prayer and ask God to give you a new perspective toward these things.

4. **Do your part.** In this session, the presenter teaches that we are co-builders with God, working with Him to build His custom house—Zion. You will see that every believer has been called by God with a specific purpose at a specific time, just as subcontractors on a natural house all fulfil a specific role at specific times. More than this, you will learn that all your work will be tested and only what is built by His grace will last forever. Challenge: Take time to identify your passions and gifts (the things you love doing, and the things you're good at). After identifying these things, write a mission statement for your life. Ask God to reveal how your mission builds Zion.
5. **It starts here.** In this session, the presenter will discuss the only way to know your specific calling. You will learn from the Bible and John's own testimony that when you seek God diligently, expecting Him to speak to you, you will find Him and He will reveal your calling. Challenge: What does create space in your life look like? Write in your journal what God reveals to you
6. **Get planted.** In this session, the presenter describes one of the simplest ways to discover who you are and what you are called to do—plant yourself, even when it means needing to forgive offenses. You will learn to follow God in this, asking God where to plant, and how to know when it's time to leave where you are planted. Challenge: Identify the soil (environments) that God has planted you in. Take one action step to deepen your roots in each of these environments—e.g., family, church, vocation, etc.
7. **The calling Killers.** In this session, the presenter warns that your calling can be hindered and even killed. You will learn about the hindrance that security, money, or relationships can be when they become more important than following God. Challenge: Identify the sins and entanglements that are holding you back from fulfilling your calling. Humble yourself and repent. As you do, God will flood you with His grace, and you will rise above the attacks of the enemy.
8. **Follow the Directions:** In this session, the presenter examines how being led by the Holy Spirit through life is the only way to fulfil your calling. You will understand what this means as you hear several practical examples from the presenter's story. Challenge: Reflect on areas of your life that have been managed or directed by your own strengths. What does it look like for you to entrust your gifts to God? Collect these thoughts in your journal.
9. **Stay the course:** In this session, the presenter describes a necessary process that's part of every believer's journey to discover and fulfil their calling. You will see why God takes you through this process and learn helpful steps to walk through it

successfully. Challenge: 1. Make a list of trials in your life and look for God's redemptive thread. 2. Read Philippians 4 and meditate on its truths. 3. Make a list of things you are grateful for.

10. The compound effect. In this session, the presenter examines how God measures your faithfulness in fulfilling your calling and shows that the measure is multiplication. You will understand not only what this means, but also that it is never too late to begin multiplying what God has entrusted to you. Challenge: Write a contract with God, giving Him your gifts and calling. This contract is simply an acknowledgment of your dependence on Him and your need of His help. When you trust Him, God will infuse every day with purpose and opportunity.

6. DRIVEN BY ETERNITY



One day you will stand before God and give an account of your life. The most important question you can ask yourself now is, will you be ready?

1. The eternal. Eternity has been placed in our hearts, and each of us sense that we were made for more. Even those who have hardened their hearts to convince themselves there is no God have come to realize at the end of their lives, there is something more beyond death. The presenter reveals the importance of

maximizing our time on earth so that we can make our life count both now and for eternity.

2. The eternal home of the dead. Scripture tells us hell is a real place, not figurative as our society has endeavoured to promote. Because it is one of His elementary teachings, Jesus discussed hell frequently, much more often than the subject is mentioned from pulpits today. He didn't view its mention as insensitive or as lacking compassion. The presenter discusses how the teaching of hell is an essential component for preparing people to receive the gospel.

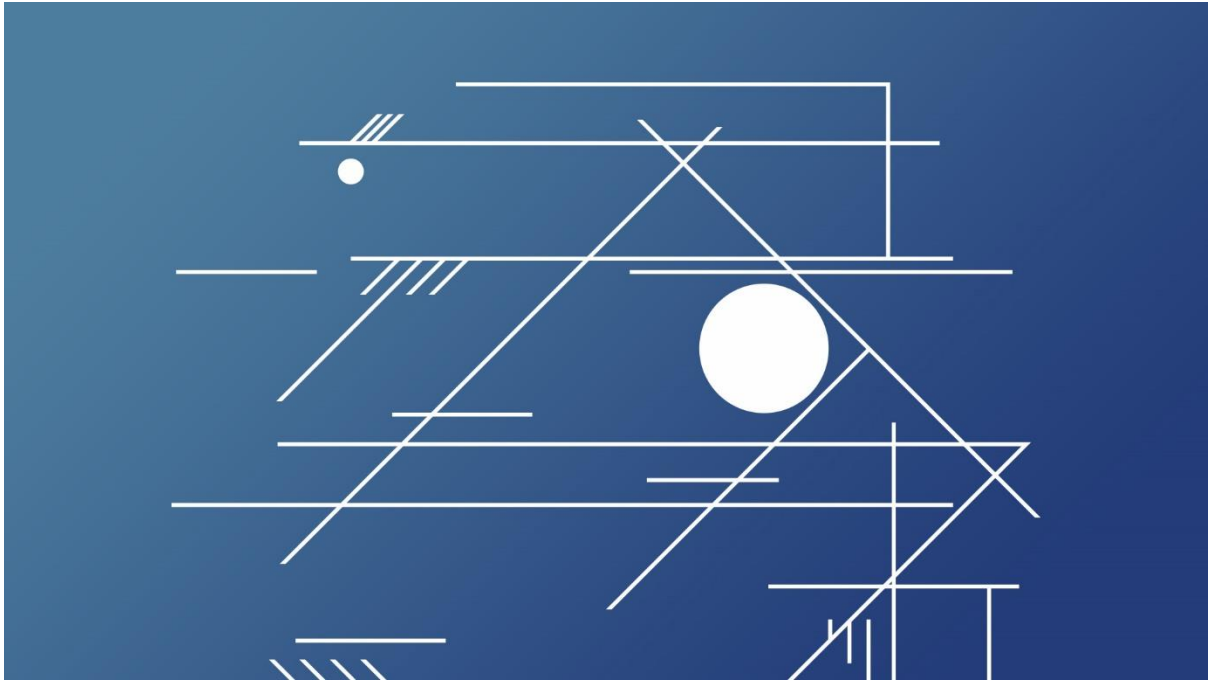
3. The Foundation. In a careful study of the Gospels, you'll notice that Jesus spoke of and described hell more than He did heaven. He did this to plant a foundation within us—the fear of God. Those who lack this foundation will surely slip into the fear of man, and we ultimately serve who we fear. The presenter teaches on the importance of cultivating the fear of the Lord in our life—which includes a holy awe of the judgments of Christ.

4. The judgement seat of Christ. Everyone will face judgment one day, including Christians. No one is exempt. It will surely come for all people. Sadly, numerous individuals in the church are unaware that they will give an account of what they've done during their short stay on earth. The presenter addresses the erroneous idea that all future judgment is eradicated by salvation. Indeed, Jesus's blood cleanses us from the sins that would have kept us from the kingdom; however, it does not exempt us from the judgment of how we conducted ourselves as believers, whether good or bad.

5. God's custom House. Our ability to build the kingdom is entirely based upon our obedience to the Holy Spirit because we can do nothing of eternal value unless it is by the grace of Jesus Christ. We can build apart from God's Spirit, yet that labour is worthless in the light of eternity. It will be burned up at the Judgment Seat. The presenter teaches that at the Judgment Seat of Christ, we'll not be judged according to what we did, but according to what we were called to do. Because only acts of obedience will guarantee that our labour is not in vain.

6. Multiplication and personal influence. Those who serve faithfully in the kingdom will be rewarded at the Judgment Seat of Christ. We will be rewarded for our work individually, as each of us have been given different callings and responsibilities with the purpose of impacting lives for eternity. The presenter reveals how God does not reward as man does. He rewards according to righteous works of obedience—which include how we built the kingdom and how we influenced individual lives.

7. FAITH: THE KEY TO RELEASING HEAVEN ON EARTH



Faith. It's a word we all hear all the time in the church- yet for so many, the concept feels a bit illusive. This course will take you on a profound journey through scripture to see what God has to say about this

1. **What is faith?** Faith is foundational to following Jesus. In this lesson, the presenter explains what faith is and how through faith, we can bridge the eternal to the temporal, the supernatural to the natural, and the Kingdom realm to the earthly realm.
2. **Why is faith so important?** Faith is vitally important in the life of every believer. In this lesson, the presenter explains how without faith, we cannot please God, because faith not only makes it possible to have a relationship with Him, it also gives us access to all His promises.
3. **Faith and God's Promises:** Faith activates the power and promises of God's Word. In this lesson, the presenter explains how receiving God's promises is not automatic—they must be activated and received by faith. He also reveals how to come into agreement with God's Word, so we'll see His promises established in our life.
4. **Faith and answered prayer:** Prayer that is fuelled by faith releases God's answers, will, and Kingdom into the earth. In this lesson, the presenter explains

how through prayer, we give God permission to work on our behalf. He also discusses what hinders our prayers from being answered.

5. **How to get faith:** God's Word is the source of our faith. In this lesson, the presenter explains that when we feed on God's Word, faith is awakened in our hearts. And the more we hear God's Word, the more faith can fill our hearts.
6. **How to release your faith: Part one.** Faith originates in the heart and is released through our words. In this lesson, the presenter explains how faith speaks—calling forth those things which be not as though they existed.
7. **How to release your faith: Part Two.** The words we speak reveal what's in our heart. In this lesson, the presenter explains that when our hearts are filled with faith, our words will be also! He also explains how to guard your heart so that your faith remains strong.
8. **Increase your faith:** There are levels to faith. In this lesson, the presenter explains how we've all been given a measure of faith which we're responsible to steward. He also provides the steps you can apply to increase your faith.
9. **The testing of your faith:** Under pressure, our faith exhibits its true colours. In this lesson, the presenter explains the purpose of testing and trials, and how we'll never know how strong our faith is until it's tested.
10. **The Fight of faith:** Keeping the faith is vital to finishing strong and laying hold of eternal life. In this lesson, the presenter teaches how to contend for your faith. He also reveals the enemies of faith and how to become lovers of truth.
11. **Gospel examples:** Throughout the Gospels, we discover Jesus performing a plethora of healings, miracles, and deliverances. In this lesson, the presenter uses stories from Jesus's ministry to build your faith and to explain how faith works.
12. **Practical counsel:** Faith should not be reduced to a formula, but there are practical steps to be applied when exercising your faith. In this lesson, the presenter explains how to practically apply your faith so you can become a person who lives by faith.

2. Unity in Diversity

3. The Social Experiment

Social awareness is a tool that can unite all sons and daughters—regardless of our gender, race, or story. We all come from different backgrounds and experiences, and that's why it's important to be conscious of how our actions affect others—because what might be permissible to you may be offensive to others.

4. Divided We Fall

Disunity occurs when there is a clash in views, beliefs, and opinions. This can often lead to unnecessary fights and arguments. But when we walk in love, we can address problems without attacking people.

5. The Things That Separate Us

Division is like a disease that can spread quickly. Common symptoms include gossip, slander, and discord. If left unchecked, we can become separated from those we care about the most. That's why we must protect our relationships and avoid those things that separate us.

6. Don't You Dare Compare

Comparison fosters rivalry. That's because when we compare ourselves with others, we lose sight of what God has given us and we begin to envy what others have. If left unaddressed, comparison will either puff you up with pride—causing you to think you're better than others—or it can push you down—causing you to become insecure.

7. Unity of Faith

The early church—as described in the book of Acts—lived in harmony and displayed great power. The greatest challenge leaders faced was protecting the church from false teaching and doctrine. Unfortunately, that has been the reason for the existence of many different denominations in the church today. If we are to become unified, we'll need to unite around the foundational doctrines of our faith—majoring on what is most important.

8. Escape the Traps of Offense

Offense builds walls between people, causing separation. That's why it's important to deal with your offender sooner than later, rather than allowing resentment to accumulate. As believers, when we remember how much we've been forgiven of, we are empowered to forgive those who have wronged us. And when we forgive, we not only free ourselves from the prison of offense—we also liberate others.

9. Cliques and Christians

From an early age, we gravitate toward those who are similar to us. As a result, we develop cliques. Although it's common to associate with those who are like-minded—we miss out on so much from those we exclude. But when we're inclusive, we'll enlarge our community and broaden our sphere of influence.

10. Straight Talk

Healthy relationships involve conflict. Without the hard conversations, relationships remain shallow. But if we want to connect with each other on a deeper level, it will require courage, honesty, and vulnerability. Then we'll become closer with each other and we'll experience the depth of relationship we desire.

11. Never Fly Solo

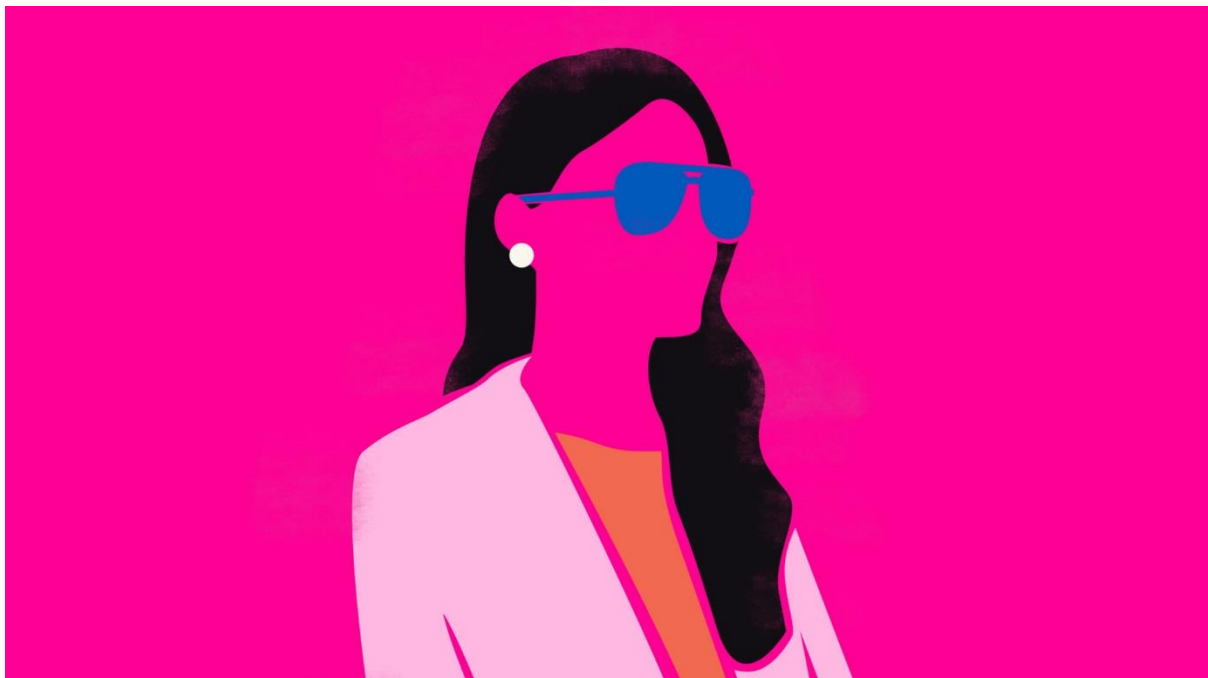
More can be accomplished with a team than can be accomplished alone. But in order to function as a team, we must learn how to work as one. Creating unity within a team dynamic

requires systems, order, and structure. Only then can we flourish in our unique roles and positions.

12. On the Same Page

Disunity is a communication problem. To communicate effectively with others—whether that's one-on-one or in a group—we must learn how to connect with them. When we connect with people, we'll relate with them in a way that builds trust and increases influence.

1. The Struggle is Real. The presenter dives into some of the common struggles single people wrestle with and offers some fresh perspective.

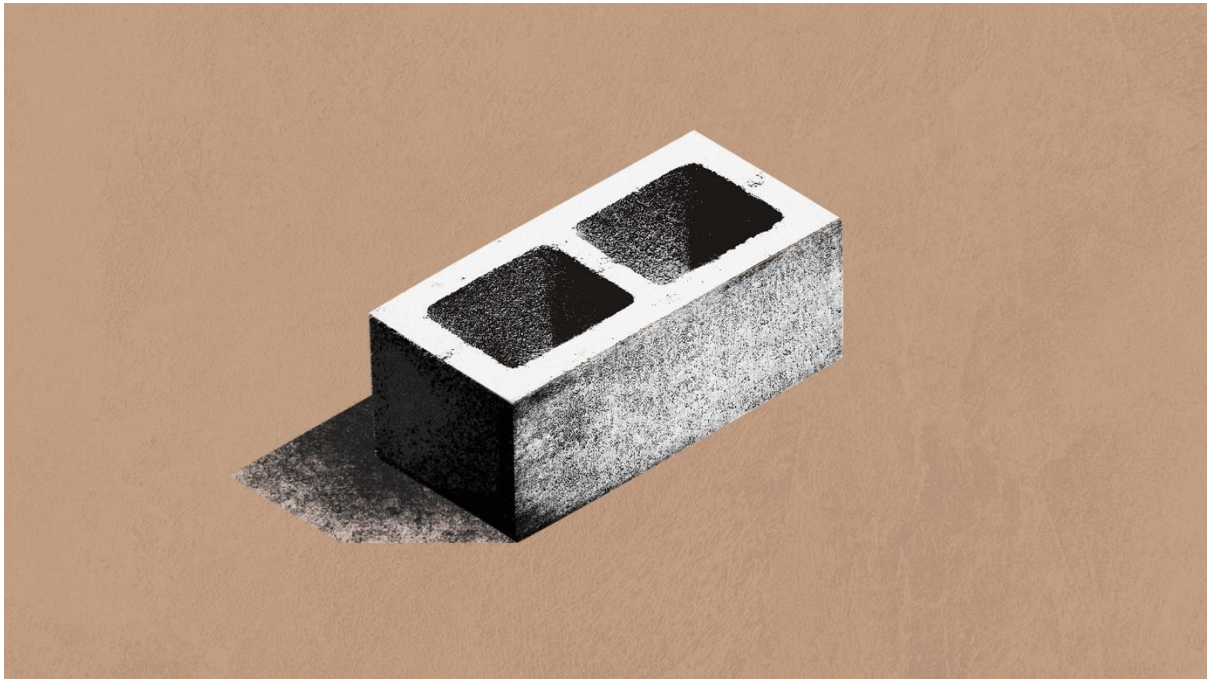
2. Avoid These Mistakes. The presenter explores some of the most common mistakes people make in singleness—and how to avoid them

10. FOUNDATIONS

Have you ever wondered why some people keep growing in their faith, yet others seem to stay stuck or even go backwards? It all comes down to foundations. Whether you are just starting or you need to go back and fix some cracks, it's time to expedite your spiritual growth by building the right way.



1. **Foundations.** For a building to be constructed properly, builders must follow a specific blueprint designed by engineers, beginning with the foundation phase. Similarly, God—the Master Builder—has a specific blueprint and building design for our lives that can be found through studying His Word and yielding to His Spirit. A life that is built on obedience to God's Word endures the test of time.
2. **Repentance from dead works.** Repentance levels and straightens the ground of our heart to prepare us for building according to God's design. True repentance occurs when we realize our sinful condition and our need for a Saviour. This revelation will change the way we perceive ourselves and God, and it should also change the way we live.
3. **Faith toward God.** Faith is a personal response to the gospel—providing the point of contact between the temporal and the eternal. Faith is not just mentally

acknowledging what Jesus has accomplished for us; it is also believing with the heart. As we hear the gospel, it must be received with faith—which, ultimately, is the way we connect with our Creator, receive salvation, and experience a covenant righteousness.

4. **Baptism Part 1:** The Bible refers to five specific types of baptisms: the baptism of John the Baptist (repentance), the baptism into the Body of Christ, water baptism, the baptism of the Holy Spirit, and the baptism of fire. Participating in baptism is both a *total* and a *transitional* experience—total in the sense that it involves the whole person and transitional in the sense that it marks a passing out of one place or stage into another.
5. **Baptisms - Part 2** The baptism of the Holy Spirit is an experience in which we become filled with God's Spirit—overwhelmed with His presence abiding within us. The infilling of the Holy Spirit is a separate experience from water baptism, but it's not a one-time event—rather, it is a continual experience. Endued with power from on high, we are set free from the power of sin and equipped with supernatural gifts that enable us to go beyond our natural ability.
6. **Laying on of Hands.** To understand the doctrine and practice of the laying on of hands, we must first understand the kingdom principle regarding authority. When we meet God, we meet authority, because God and His authority are inseparable. Authority is, ultimately, the way of life in God's kingdom. By submitting to it, we come under God's divine covering and protection and within this context, blessing and power are transferred.
7. **Resurrection of the Dead.** The Bible clearly informs that when Jesus returns for the church—His bride—we shall be changed! Our bodies will be transformed in an instant—completing our salvation. To comprehend the full scope of the salvation process, we must understand man's triune nature of spirit, soul, and body and how the resurrection will both confirm and consummate our salvation. As the bride of Christ, we are destined for a glorious future.
8. **Eternal Judgment.** The Bible has a lot to say about heaven, eternity, and judgment. Numerous Christians are unaware that they will give an account of their life before God. However, we will not give account of our sins—as they have been eradicated by the blood of Jesus. At the believer's judgement, God will make eternal decisions on how faithful we were in following His plans, and we will be rewarded or suffer loss in accordance to our obedience.

11. FOCUS 5

Saying yes to many good things translates to saying no to the most meaningful. To correct this imbalance, we'll need to renew our focus. As believers, our focus and attention must be on Jesus and His purpose for our life. When Jesus becomes our focus, we'll become more like Him and we'll accomplish all that He desires to do through us. It's time to say yes to what matters most!

1. Jesus is Our Focus. We can have all the power, ingenuity, and brilliance in the world, but they would amount to nothing unless we focus and direct them toward a specific target or outcome. In this lesson, the presenter shares how our focus and attention must be on Jesus and His purpose for our life. Only then will we realize our potential and accomplish all He desires to do through us.

2. Fast to Focus. The way you see is far more important than the way you look. In this lesson, the presenter explains the difference between a fast and a diet. The presenter also discusses how when we engage in God's chosen fast, we'll see Him move on our behalf in unprecedented ways.

03. Edit to Focus. Editing is the ability to remove what is extra and unnecessary so that what is important can really stand out. In this lesson, the presenter explains the art of editing and how that applies to becoming focused. She also empowers us to make our worlds smaller so that we can accomplish more.

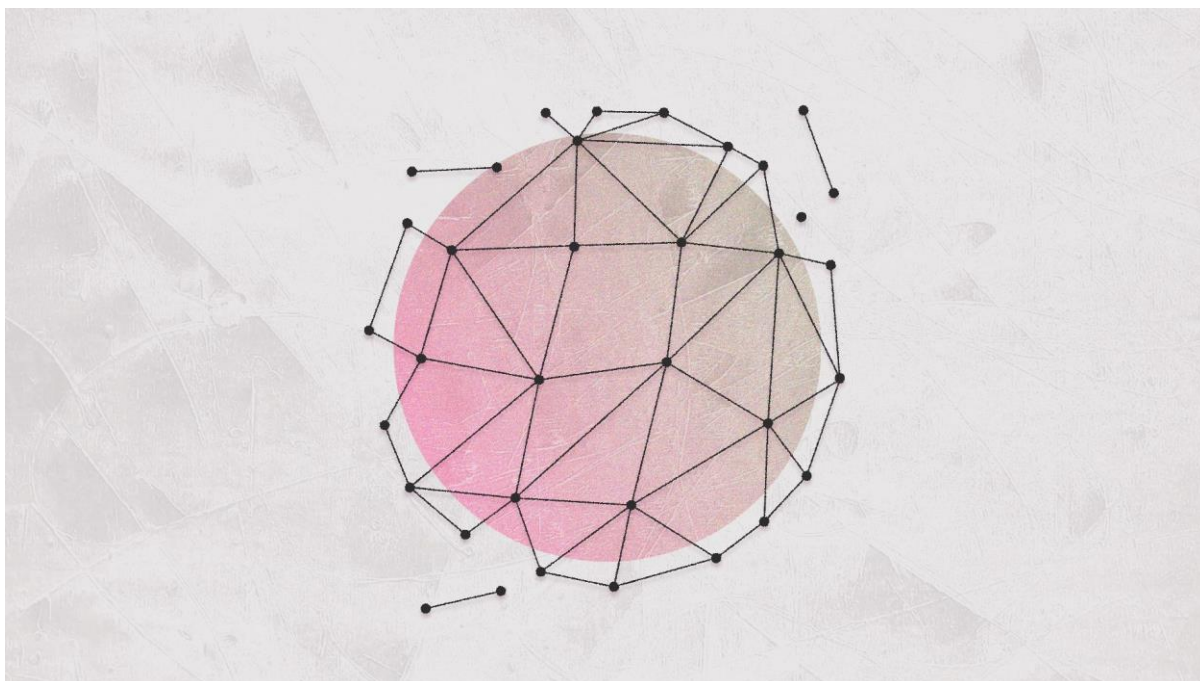

2. **Grace Gifts.** Your destiny, which God has prepared for you, is beyond your natural ability to fulfil. In this lesson, the presenter explains why we need grace—God's empowering presence that gives us the ability to go beyond our natural limitations—and how grace fuels our gifts for eternal impact.
3. **Impartation.** Gifts can be imparted in two ways—at conception or at a specific time by God's Spirit. In this lesson, the presenter explains the different ways in which God gifts His children and how we're responsible to use our gifts to serve others.
4. **Assessing Your Gifts.** Happy and blessed is the person who knows their gifts and operates in them. Miserable and stressed is the person who tries to operate in

someone else's gifts. In this lesson, the presenter explains that when we evaluate our gifts, we'll discover our strengths and avoid unnecessary frustration.

5. **Stewardship.** Each of us are stewards of the gifts God has given us. In this lesson, the presenter discusses how a steward is responsible for overseeing what belongs to another. They carry authority to manage what has been entrusted to them and how they will give an account of their stewardship.
6. **Motivation.** At any given time, you can choose to use the gifts God has given you in one of three ways. In this lesson, the presenter explains the three types of motivation for using your gift while also discussing how to increase your influence and impact.
7. **Discover Your Gift.** Destiny leaves clues. In this lesson, the presenter explains how there are no formulas to discover your calling and gifts. Even though there are various resources that can help you discover what you're good at, locating your calling and gifts will require God's involvement.
8. **Develop Your Gift.** The degree to which your gifts are developed will greatly increase your chances for promotion. In this lesson, the presenters explain how your gifts create pathways for you to progress in your calling. They also share how to develop your gift so that you can realize your potential.

13. GIRLS WITH SWORDS

In this course, the presenter will show you how to wield the sword of God's Word with both precision and bravery, equipping you with the skills you need to become dangerous for God's kingdom.



1. You Are a Target. The attacks on your life have much more to do with who you might be in the future than who you have been in the past. Becoming who God created you to be is at once your best offense and defines against all the enemy's strategy. The role you choose to play in the altercation is what is in question. Will you be an unarmed civilian, victim, prisoner of war, or hero?

2. A Sword is Born. Far too many of God's daughters in this generation are unarmed. Not only does this mean they are ill-equipped and unprepared—it also means they are at risk and incredibly vulnerable to deception. This is the very reason we need the Word of God, that we may live in the light and learn how to master our own words.

3. Heroes and Battlegrounds. God has already written you into the storyline of faith heroes, and it is an epic of triumphant proportions filled with miracles, battles, signs, and wonders. This is not your story—it is His story. When God is looking to do something grander than we can design, He brings us into His plans—rather than blessing what we have constructed.

4. The Cross as a Sword. The conquest of the cross was more than timeless—it is eternal. The cross bridged the gaping chasm between heaven and earth to reconcile God and man and went on to transform what appeared to be horrific defeat into stunning triumph. No other victory was compelling enough to reach back and light mankind's dark history while at the same time extending its rays into all that we know as the future.

5. Forging Warriors and Swords. Each day you can choose what you will serve—fear or love. We cannot choose our time period or family, and there are times we cannot choose our battles—but we always have the power to choose how we will fight. Like the process

of tempering a sword, God uses the battles we face to equip and prepare us for future battles.

6. Sword Words. All Scripture has the potential to teach, correct, prepare, and equip us. This is why we are charged to wield it with grace. This divine weapon we hold has the power to destroy the enemy's strongholds. We speak the Word of God as a weapon heard long before it is ever seen.

7. Swords. God is asking us to forge new trails by reopening ancient paths. More than ever, we need God's Word to clear paths in the wild so we can find our way out of the dark. Discernment is the ability to distinguish light in the distance. As we wield the swords of harvest, song, silence, light, and restoration, we'll empower others to arise out of the shadows!

8. How to Carry Your Cross Like a Hero. Jesus bore our cross so we could wear His crown. He became like us so we can become like Him. This dynamic of becoming like Christ is realized through discipleship, which we live by daily walking with Him. If He is with us and He is the same yesterday, today, and forever—then He is willing to display on earth all that the cross has purchased.

14. GODMOTHERS

The presenter doesn't have all the answers, but she knows that when women come together, it closes the gaps in our lives. So, pour yourself a cup of tea (or a double shot of espresso), curl up in your favourite chair, and get ready for some real talk. As you journey through this study, may you laugh, learn, and discover God's heart for you in this season.



1. Why You Need One

Godmothers enter our lives to close gaps. In this lesson, the presenter identifies these gaps and reveals why, more than ever, it's time for godmothers and goddaughters to connect.

2. The Frozen Gap

God is too big of a target to miss. In this lesson, the presenter explains how the enemy uses the fear of missing God to immobilize God's daughters. She also addresses other limiting mindsets and provides the insights to overcome them.

3. Buried Treasure

When you bury your talent, you rob both yourself and others. In this lesson, the presenter explains how we are entrusted with gifts, and that our Father would not have given us these abilities if we were incapable of multiplying them.

Welcome

However, when the light of truth enters their lives, it affects the way people view God, themselves, and others—and ultimately impacts every area of their lives.

1. Rest for Your Soul

Jesus promised that when we come to Him, we'll find rest for our souls. Sadly, many believers struggle with unrest—striving for God's acceptance because they haven't entered into the rest available to them. But it doesn't have to be that way. In this lesson, the presenter teaches us how to enter into the rest of God and how you can function at your best from a place of rest.

2. Boundaries (Part 1)

Self-control is one of the greatest displays of strength. A person who cannot take responsibility for their behaviour is like a city without walls—they're prone to defeat. In this lesson, the presenter discusses the three levels of control and how when a person lacks self-control, they abdicate their power and become a victim of their environment—often casting blame onto others.

3. Boundaries (Part 2)

Boundaries are the invisible property lines of our life. In this lesson, the presenter discusses how boundaries are the basis for our personal identity—defining who we are and what we stand for. Just like walls and fences mark the boundaries of our homes, our relational boundaries outline the territory for which we are responsible.

4. The Power of Love

When we learn to receive God's love for us, we are empowered to both love ourselves and to love others. In this lesson, the presenter discusses how when we learn to connect with God and implement healthy boundaries, we'll begin to know ourselves, like ourselves, and be ourselves.

5. Healthy Ways to Fulfil Your Needs

The number one relationship mistake people make is attempting to have legitimate needs met in unhealthy ways. In this lesson, Chip discusses the importance of looking to God first and most to have our needs met. When we seek to fulfil these needs apart from God, we fall into idolatry and are left disappointed.

6. Making Good Choices

For most of us, we've learned to make good decisions by making bad ones. That's because the way we learn to control ourselves is by paying for the moments when we don't. In this lesson, the presenter discusses how each of us are responsible for the consequences of our choices and how we can learn to make good decisions that align with our values and beliefs.

7. Uprooting Destructive Behaviours

Our ability to have healthy relationships with God, others, and ourselves were fractured by the fall. These effects have rippled down throughout every generation. In this lesson, the presenter discusses how early life experiences are instrumental to the development of our relationship skills and patterns. He discusses how we are not responsible for the way we were brought up, but we are responsible for changing the way we are.

8. Parenting with Boundaries

Parenting can be condensed into three developmental stages: dependence, independence, and interdependence. In this lesson, the presenter discusses the age-appropriate freedom that should be given in each of these stages, and the importance of allowing room for children to experience the consequences of their decisions, both good and bad.

9. Developing Healthy Boundaries

Healthy boundaries are established when we take responsibility for ourselves. This begins with our circle of responsibility—those things we have direct control over. In this lesson, the presenter discusses the importance of changing yourself so that the behaviour of others no longer affects you. Interestingly, more people suffer from trying to change or control others than any other disease.

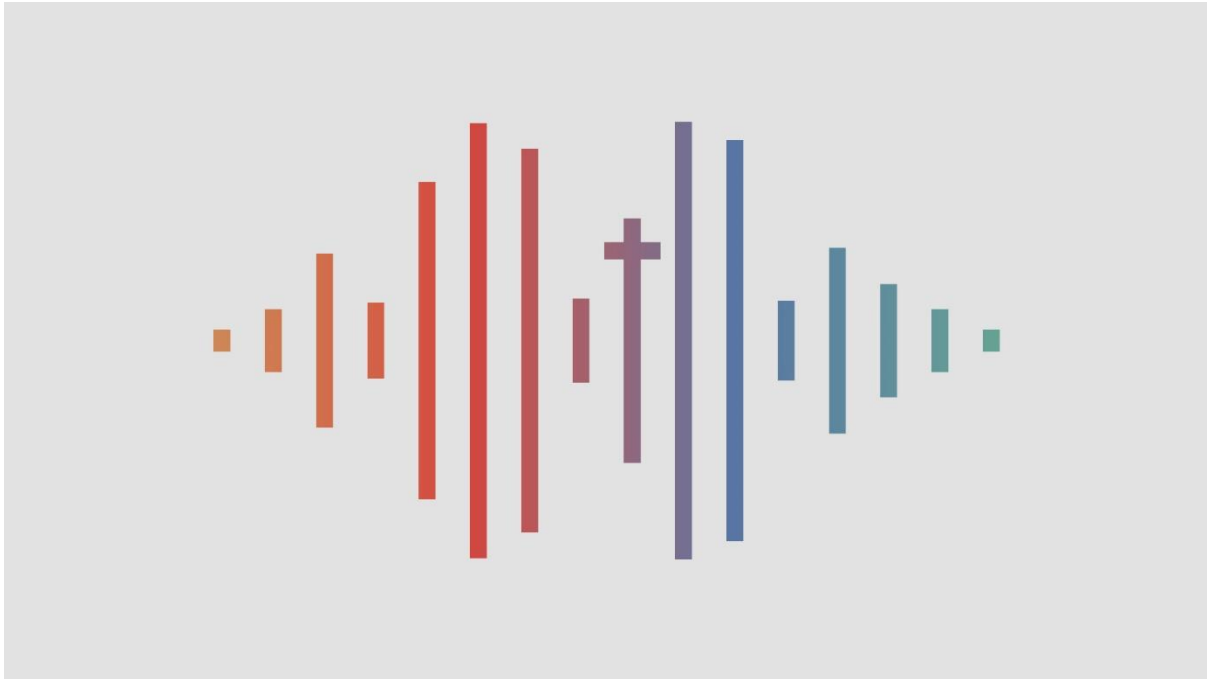
10. What Are You Thinking?

Transformation occurs by changing the way you think. In this lesson, the presenter discusses why most people feel frustrated and powerless in regard to their emotional responses and cycles, and that the real problem is rooted in their thoughts. That's why it's important to think about what you're thinking about, because our thoughts influence our emotions.

11. Building a Support System

In order to make effective changes, we need a support system. In this lesson, the presenter discusses the importance of surrounding ourselves with emotionally healthy people and how when we do that, it greatly influences our chances of becoming emotionally healthy ourselves.

18. HEARING GOD



1. **Does God Still Speak?** Hearing God's voice is vital to sustaining a life-giving relationship with Him. If you have been trying to follow God without regularly hearing His voice, you're missing out on a profound aspect of knowing Him. God is a communicator and loves to commune with His children.
2. **Eliminating Voice Blockers.** If God seems silent to you, it could be that there are things blocking you from hearing His voice. To keep the channels of communication open between you and God, you must recognize and remove the barriers that separate you from Him. (Distraction/busyness, Competing Voices, Unprepared Heart, Not having your heart in a neutral position-Idols in your heart, Sin)
3. **Intimacy with the Holy Spirit:** The Holy Spirit is the most ignored person in the church. This is one of the main reasons that people experience a disconnect with God. As you cultivate a relationship with God's Spirit, you'll experience greater depths of intimacy with Him.
4. **Ways God's speak Part One:** God speaks at various times and in various ways. Of course, words are but one of His many forms of communication. When we discover the variety of methods in which He speaks, we'll become more receptive to His voice.
5. **Ways God's speak Part Two:** God will speak with you, but unless you write it down, it can easily be forgotten. Keeping a record of what God has said will help

you retain all that He has spoken. Learn to filter out the plethora of voices that fight for your attention by remembering God's spoken Word.

6. **The Authenticity of Scripture.** When discussing the topic of hearing God, it's important to do so within the parameters provided by the Scriptures. When you consider how the entire Bible—both Old and New Testaments—were compiled, there's no question it was a miraculous work of God. With God's Spirit as the author, we can trust the authenticity of the Scriptures.
7. **Hearing God through the Bible.** The God of the Word will speak to you through the Word of God. With the aid of God's Spirit, you'll gain insight into that which was previously hidden. Although God's Spirit will speak to us many things outside of the Bible, He will never speak to us anything contrary to the Bible.
8. **The relevance of the Old Testament.** When considering the relevance of the Old Testament, choose any major theme or subject in the New Testament and you'll need to go to the Old Testament to fully understand it. More importantly, if we want to know Jesus, there is so much that the Old Testament reveals about Him.
9. **Seeking God Diligently.** God waits to be wanted. Those who diligently seek God will not be disappointed, for they will be rewarded with His presence. Diligent seeking begins with taking responsibility for our relationship with God.
10. **How to hear God through prayer.** Prayer fosters an atmosphere for God to speak. As you consistently spend time in prayer, you'll regularly hear from God. With any meaningful relationship, learning to communicate is a non-negotiable. Likewise, hearing God through prayer is a skill that must be cultivated.
11. **The heavenly language:** People have a lot of questions about speaking in tongues, and most of them are cleared up once they gain understanding. Through this wonderful gift of God's Spirit, we will experience direct contact with God and receive specific guidance from Him.
12. **Stewarding revelation.** Heaven has the answers and solutions we desire, but they will not be given out carelessly. They will be given to those who will steward them carefully. As we learn to steward what God reveals, He'll entrust us with more.
13. **Fasting change the way you see.** Throughout Scripture, we see that people fasted for many reasons—one of which was to grow in sensitivity to God's voice. This is because fasting positions you to hear God more clearly—shifting the way you see and altering your perspective.
14. **The Voice of conscience:** Our conscience is a gift from God—instilling us with a moral sense of right and wrong. To keep our hearts pure, we must never violate

our conscience. If we habitually ignore our conscience, it will eventually become seared, numbing our ability to hear God.

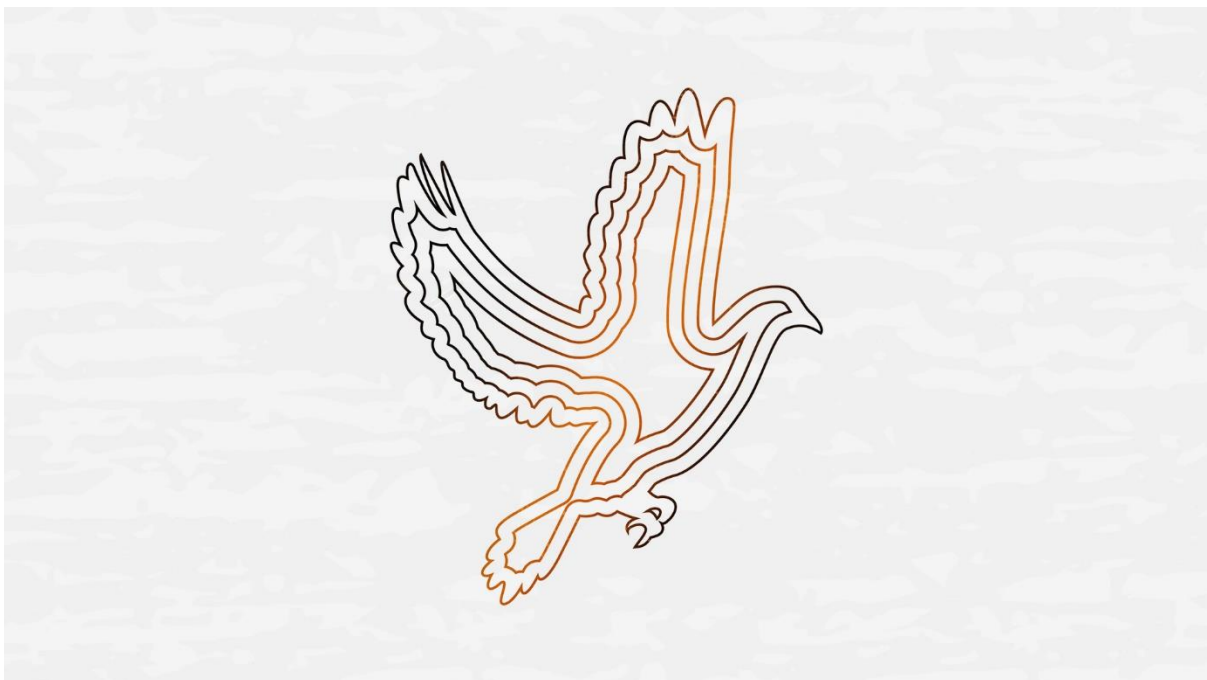
15. The voice within the voice. Jesus gave gifts to the church to equip the body, and these gifts are people. When we look for God's voice inside of someone's voice, we can enjoy the gift God made them to be. Although God desires to communicate with us directly, He also speaks through others.

16. Led by God's voice: As followers of Christ, the Lord desires to direct our steps and lead us forward into all He has planned and destined for us. Therefore, we must listen for God's voice; He's the One who will keep us on track.

17. Finding answers to big questions: There are many questions for which you can't find answers in the Bible. However, God delights in every detail of your life. When you lean into Him, He'll guide you and provide the answers to your questions.

19. HOLY SPIRIT



1. Who is the Holy Spirit? Jesus's departure was for our benefit—making way for the Holy Spirit to be with us. Yet, many do not know *who* He is and *why* He is here. In

this lesson, the presenter demystifies the confusion around God's Spirit and introduces us to the most ignored Person in the church—the Holy Spirit.

2. **The Personality of the Holy Spirit.** In order for us to enter into a close relationship with another person, we must first seek to understand what makes that individual tick. A greater knowledge of a person's likes, dislikes, aims, and ambitions will help develop a deeper friendship. Likewise, if we are to be intimate with the Holy Spirit, we must first seek to understand His personality.
3. **Three levels of relationships.** The Spirit of God desires to be your friend, and He yearns for your close fellowship. Through His abiding presence, the deepest level of relationship—the spiritual level—is available to you. In this lesson, the presenter reveals how to engage with God's Spirit at the deepest level, from which you will discover an intimacy with your Creator unlike any other.

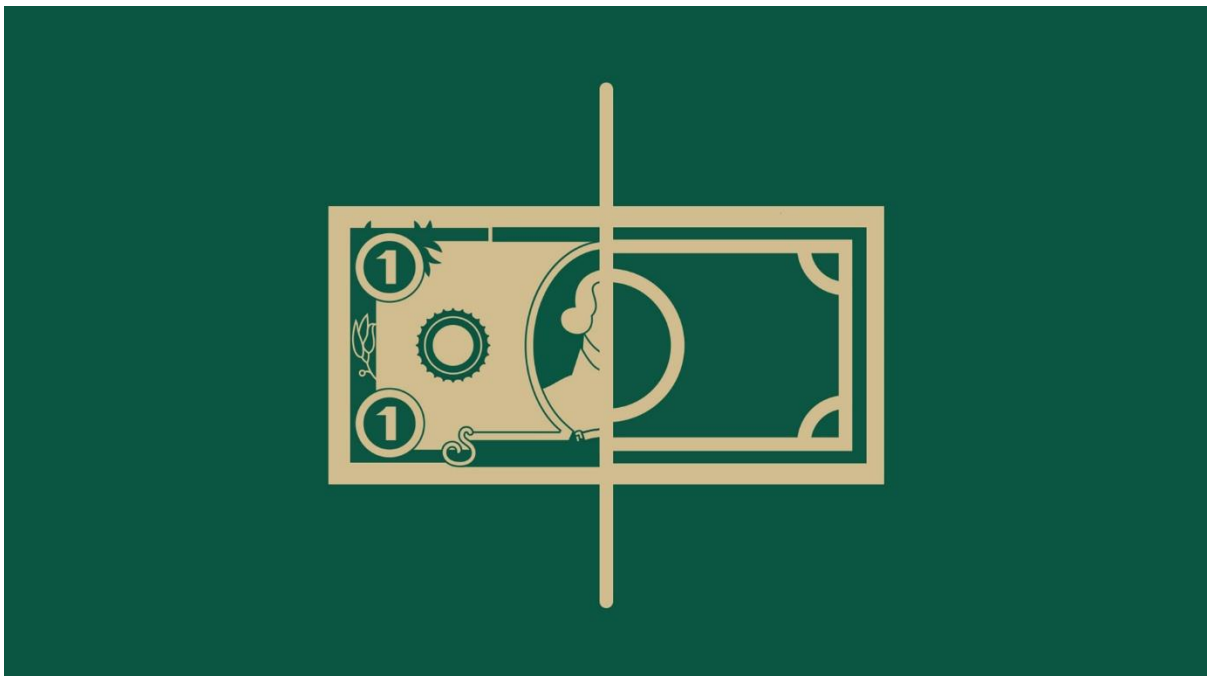

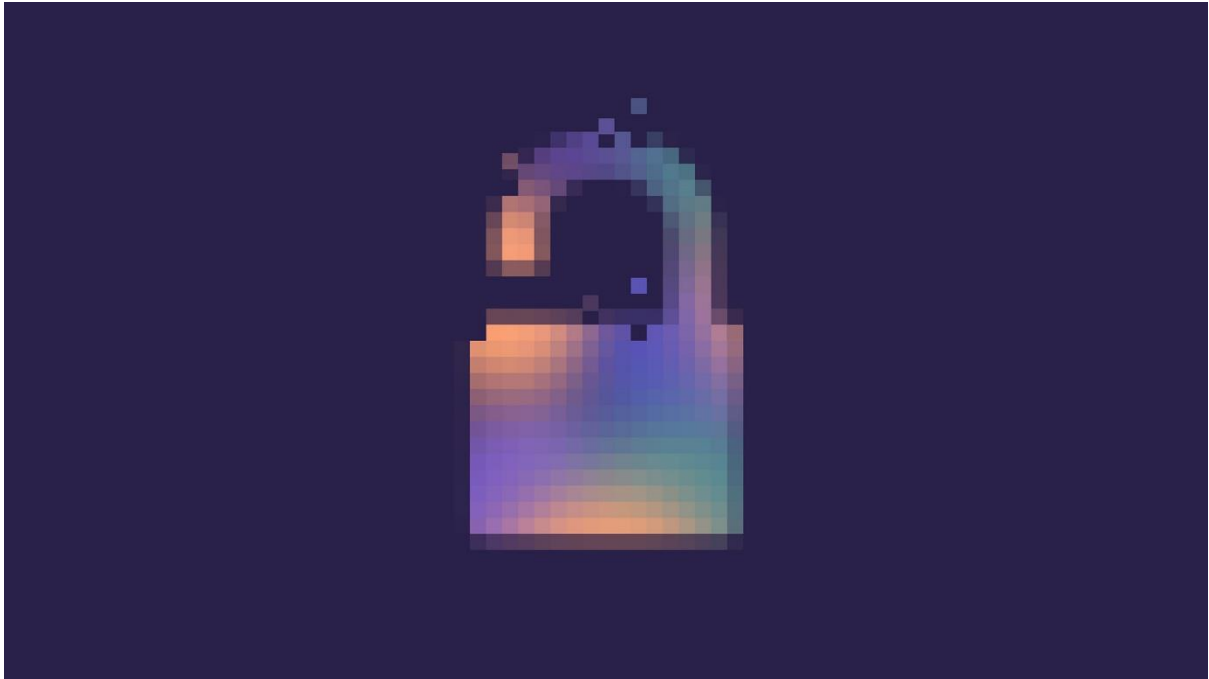

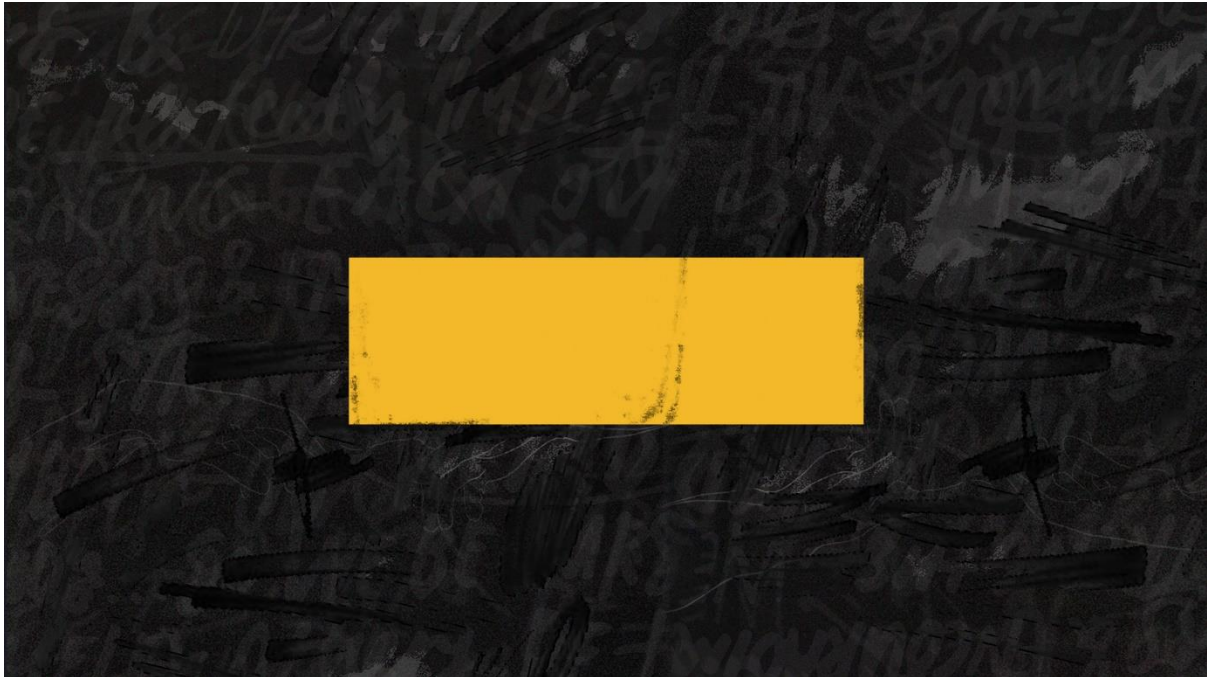

encourages us to stop viewing our doubts as a negative thing and challenges us to discover the positive benefits it can bring.

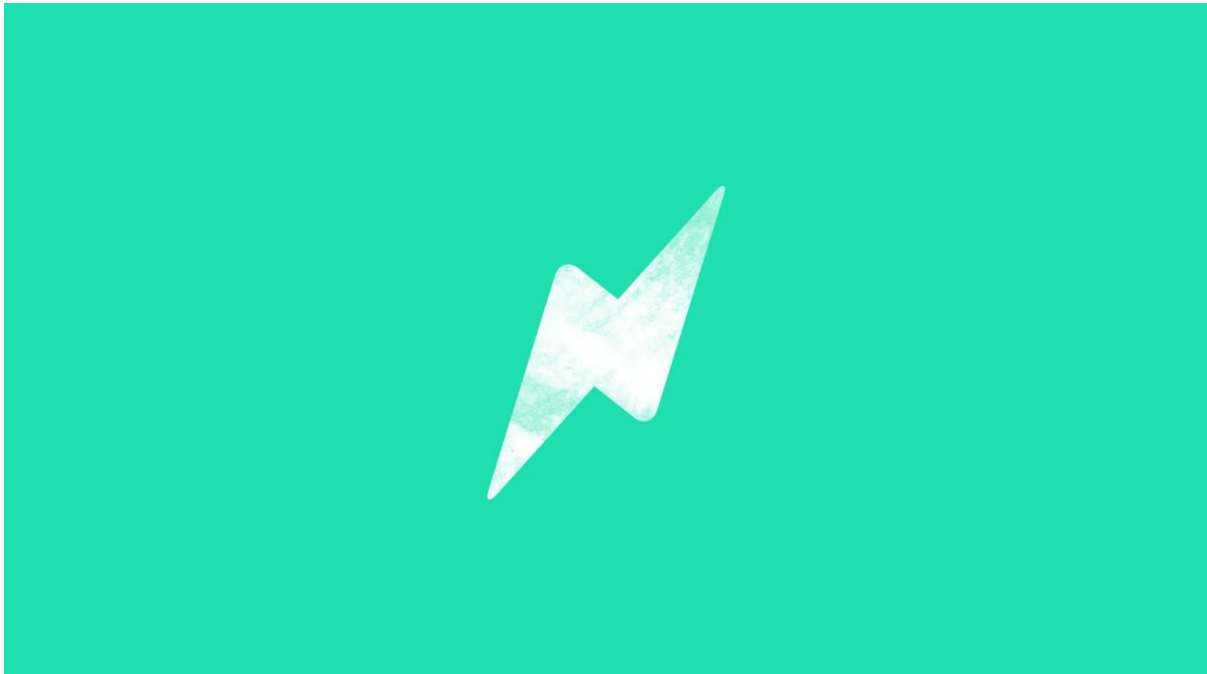

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1. Inside Out

God wasn't content to just save you for heaven. He wants to put heaven inside you, turning you into a son or daughter who reveals heaven's reality in this world. This is the process or journey of sanctification. There's nothing we can do to make ourselves "more saved." But there is a process we can engage that will position us to experience more of God's saving power today.

2. Lead Your Emotions

Our circumstances and beliefs lead to our thoughts, which create our emotions, which determine our actions. We don't always have control over our circumstances, but we have been given charge of our thoughts, emotions, actions, and beliefs. Understanding how these elements of being work together will give you the power to isolate wrong beliefs that are leading to painful or destructive thoughts, emotions, and actions.

3. Renewing Your Mind

Scripture says we are transformed by renewing our minds. In other words, changing the way we think is the key to living the transformed life we are called to live in Christ. Oftentimes, we develop destructive beliefs and strongholds over time that

profoundly affect how we process information. But there is a simple yet profound way to tear down these strongholds and replace them with the truths found in Scripture.

04. Lie: What I Do Determines My Value

So many of us struggle with the lie that our value comes from what we do, the money we make, or the things we own. By believing this lie, we are subjecting ourselves to a form of evaluation that is not of God. We see from Scripture that the value of the whole world is not as great as a single life. Even more than this, God declares that He considers our life—every individual life, not all of us together—as more valuable than His own.

05. Lie: I Have to Live in Fear and Anxiety

Not every fear is bad, but living in fear is. Everything that God created you for is on the other side of fear. Fear will tell you all the things you can't do, and people will tend to agree about what you can't do, but God won't. When we listen to God's promises more than we listen to our fears, it gives us courage to become all God created us to be.

06. Lie: God's Love is Conditional

Let's face it, human love isn't perfect. It's easy to feel like we need to perform a certain way to earn love, even from God. But if we believe this lie, nothing we ever do will be enough to make us feel accepted by God. None of us are able to earn God's love but thankfully, He chose us in love long before we were even born. Because of this truth, all of us can simply and freely receive God's love.

07. Lie: Any Good Thing Must Be Earned

The world has a way of teaching us that we aren't enough. This causes us to believe we need to earn any good thing in our lives to prove ourselves worthy. The problem with this is that when we work to earn these things in our own strength, we are relying on ourselves

instead of God. The truth is, God made us wonderfully and destined us for a purpose beyond our natural ability. When we believe God's truth, it establishes us in confidence to begin doing things we could never do if we still thought we had to prove ourselves.

08. Lie: My Emotional Health Is Controlled by Other People

Emotional health is an important thing to have. It enables us to thrive in our work and enjoy the relationships God's given to us. But too often we intentionally or unintentionally make someone else responsible for our emotional health. This decision has severe consequences and will end up compromising our relationships.

9. Lie: God Is Condemning Me

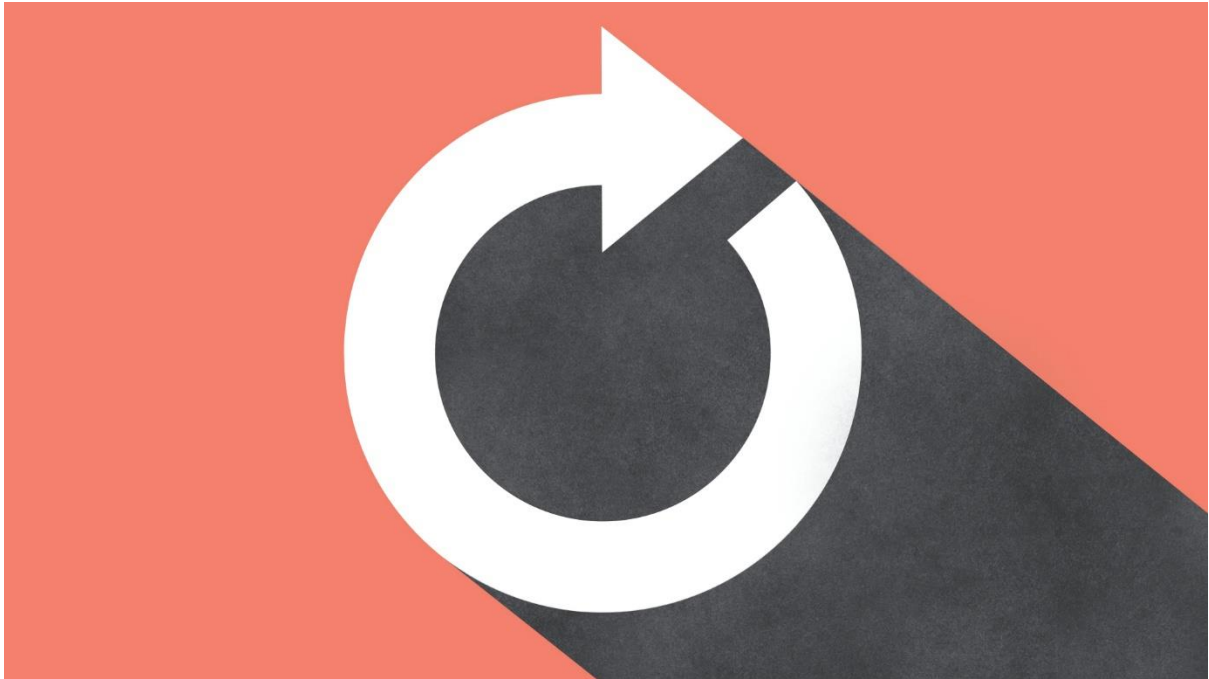

The Bible uses the word Christian to describe followers of Jesus a grand total of three times. But there's another identifier that fills the pages of the New Testament—Saints. Wrapped in this ancient word is a divine invitation to discover who God created you to be and awaken to the life you were meant to know.



1. Saints

To become a Saint is to become profoundly human. In this lesson, Addison encourages us to plunge into God's original design for humanity so that we can awaken to a life of meaning and purpose—a life that deconstructs the barriers between the sacred and the secular and impacts everyone, everywhere.

2. The Good Life

The good life isn't something you find; it's someone you become. In this lesson, the presenter challenges us to look beyond mere consumerism and redirects our perspective to something greater than we've known—a way of life that is more meaningful and fulfilling.

3. Mirror, Mirror

15. Hebrews 11 People

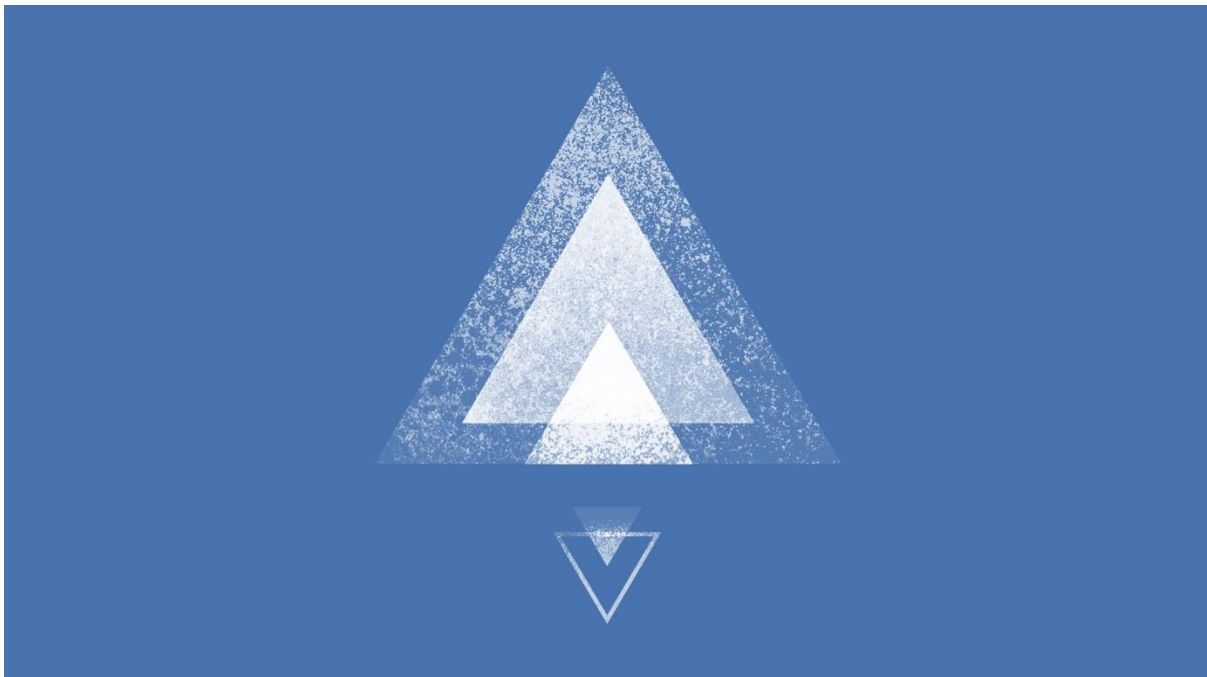

39. UNDER COVER

Have you ever wrestled with how to respond to a boss or leader when you disagree? Do you ever wonder why you should listen to them in the first place? 1. Under Cover

Submission isn't a popular word, but it's an important one. Those who submit to God's authority gain access to His peace, protection, and provision. But submitting to God's authority also means submitting to those He puts in authority—which is anyone in a

position of legitimate authority. Yes, there are many leaders who abuse and misuse their authority, but, if we let Him, God can still do a perfect work in us through these imperfect people.

2. What is Sin?

We all have our own ideas of what sin is. But the Bible gives us a clear definition: Sin is lawlessness. This means that anything we do that raises our will above the will of God is sin, even if it is something that would be good when done in the right context. This lawlessness causes our love for God to grow cold, guiding us away from the benefits of submitting to God.

3. Delegated Authority

All legitimate authority on earth is established by God, which means resisting leadership is the same as resisting God. This is true even of harsh or evil leaders, whom God has placed in their positions. There is, however, a time when we should disobey God's delegated authority. This lesson reveals how to disobey while still keeping a submissive heart and respectful attitude.

4. Civil, Social, and Family Leadership

Many Christians wonder what it looks like to submit to God's delegated authorities. God's Word makes His heart clear on the matter by stating repeatedly that dishonour toward any earthly authority is in reality dishonour toward Him. For this reason, we demonstrate respect toward all earthly authorities by obeying the law, speaking with respect for authorities, working faithfully at our jobs, and honouring the role we have in our homes. When we do this, God promises to greatly bless us.

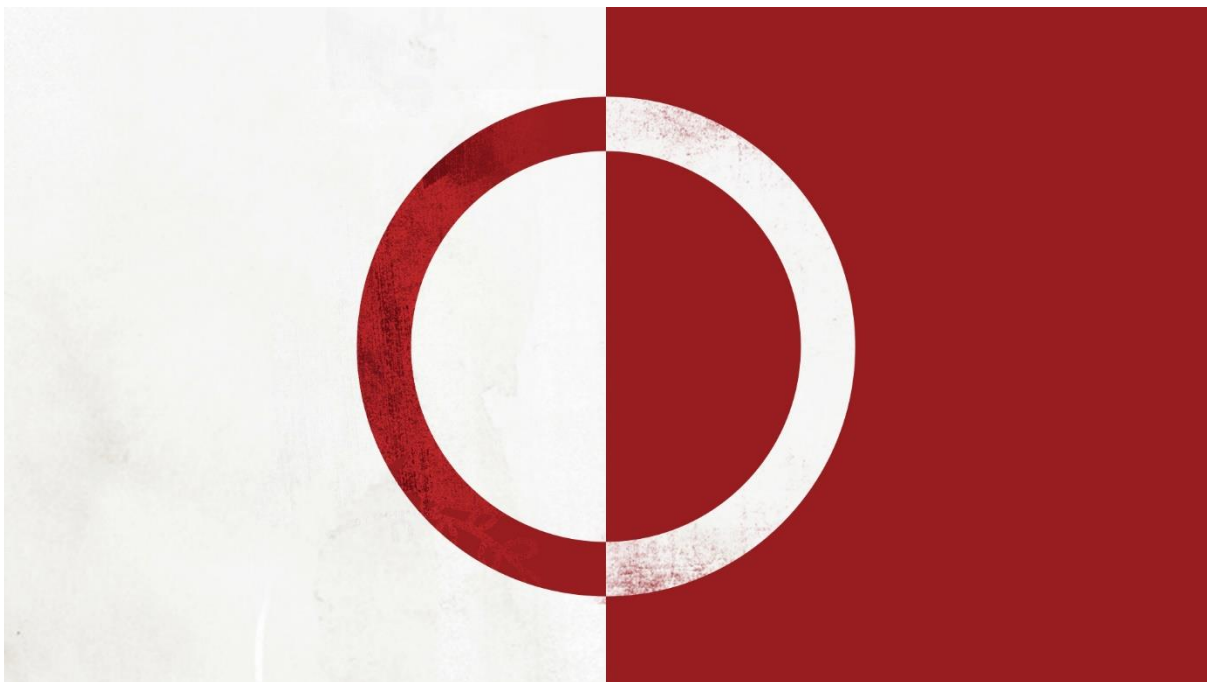

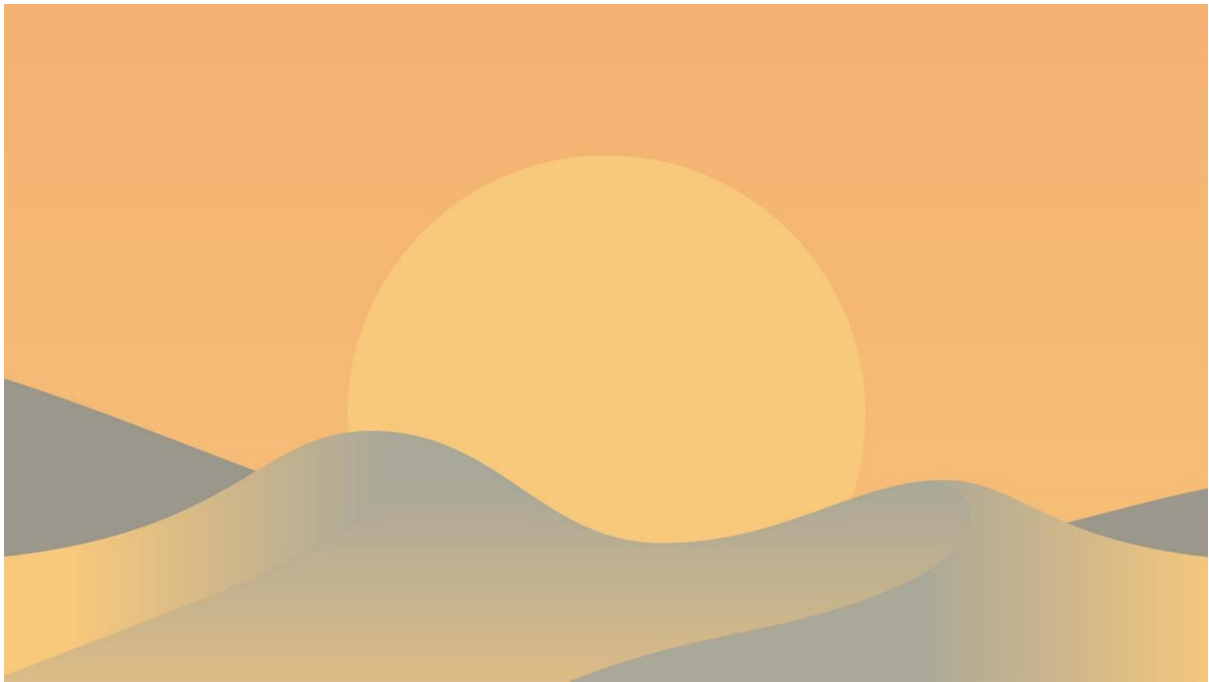

41. THE WILDERNESS

Don't stay in a place of confusion, constantly wondering what God is up to when His promises feel a million miles away. Get the tools you need to move through the wilderness with clarity, purpose, and strength, learning to embrace the process that prepares you for God's promotion



1. The Wilderness

Every believer will go through wilderness seasons where they cannot sense God's presence and feel like they're farther from His promises. It is tempting to give up during these seasons, but they are necessary times of preparation that enable us to walk in God's promises when they are fulfilled. We must learn to discern these wilderness seasons and behave in them properly, so that we can partner with God's purposes for them, receive the good He has for us in them, and move into seasons of fruitfulness again.

2. The Purpose of the Wilderness

Knowing the purposes of the wilderness helps us recognize these seasons and work in agreement with God. These purposes are to mature, strengthen, humble, and purify us, while also revealing more of both our heart and God's heart. Focusing on these purposes helps protect us from discouragement or distraction while we press on in God toward His promises.

3. The Process of a Promise

We begin a process as soon as God gives us a promise—every promise will have a process. This process refines and tests us to develop in us the character we need to successfully steward the fulfilment of the promise when it comes. While the promise

ushers us into a season of refining, it also propels us through those seasons, knowing God will be faithful to accomplish what His word has spoken.

4. Refined by Fire (Part 1)

Refining brings to the surface what has always been visible to God yet concealed to us. Just as fire purifies gold; God purifies us through the furnace of affliction, suffering and trials. The presenter reveals that when we cooperate with God's refining process, we'll emerge as transparent vessels through which His glory shall be revealed.

5. Refined by Fire (Part 2)

Jesus foretold an army of people who would prophetically prepare for His coming. He chooses this army through the process of refinement. Those who fear God and honour His name choose to endure the painful seasons of the wilderness, choosing to praise God instead of complaining in bitterness. These believers prove themselves to be fit vessels for God's service and will be used of God for His great purposes.

6. Developing a Strong Spirit

God will not test us beyond our current strength but works to grow our strength through wilderness seasons. We need the strength we gain through the wilderness for future assignments we are not currently ready for. These assignments are part of God's plan for us, and we will be accountable before Jesus for them someday, whether we were prepared to fulfil them or whether we weren't ready for lack of enduring the wildernesses.

7. Don't Birth an Ishmael

God gives promises to each one of us, but His plan to fulfil them will require faith, which means His fulfilment isn't going to look like what makes sense to us in the natural. We must surrender our natural understanding and plans to follow His leading, because only His leading will fulfil His promises the right way. If we work in our own strength, we will produce a fulfilment that actually wars against God's intended purpose.

8. Place of Revelation

When God wants to separate us unto Himself, He sometimes has to remove us from the other voices that influence our lives. In Scripture, He physically did this with people like Moses, David, Paul, and John the Baptist. It was during these wilderness seasons that He produced holiness in them, the holiness enabled them to see God, and through seeing God they were marked for their calling. It was what God revealed to them in the wilderness that enabled them to be who God created them to be, and it will be the same for us.

9. Draw from the Wells

During dry seasons of the soul, the greatest temptation is to run to worldly things for comfort—television, social media, food, and much more—but we must choose to turn instead to God. This requires us to dig wells within ourselves, persevering in worship, prayer, and meditating on God’s faithfulness. Despite the trials of dry times, these habits will refresh us and enable us to become rivers of life wherever we go.

10. New Wine

God sometimes changes how He is working in and through us, and change can be difficult for us. Knowing this, God provides a way for us to stay flexible and move with Him. When we allow Him to empty us, then wash us in His word, and we press into Him in prayer, He renews us to be able to carry His new movement.

43. I AM

There is a higher way of being, a way that stretches beyond watered-down religion and powerless sentiments. Our world has been waiting for the unveiling of God’s glorious sons and daughters, and it’s time our generation steps into that reality.

In order to do this, we have to defy worldly norms and grab hold of our covenant with God. If you are struggling with finding your calling in this copy-and-paste world, you are not alone.
