This video was filmed in Photoshop Elements but the instructions are just the same in Adobe Photoshop unless where noted.

- Open the Diamond and Dot overlay (File > Open) from our Diamond and Dots Lesson.
- Make a duplicate copy (File > Duplicate) and rename it. (**Photoshop:** Image > Duplicate).
- Close the original Diamond and Dots Overlay.

Change the Pattern Scale

- In the Layers panel, double-click on the Diamond Pattern Fill thumbnail and in the Pattern Fill dialog box, change the scale of the diamond pattern to 200%.
- In the Layers panel, click on the Visibility icon of the Dots layer to hide it.
- In the Layers panel, activate the Diamond Pattern Fill layer.

Create a Gradient Fill Layer

- in the Layers panel, click on the Create a New Fill or Adjustments layer button and choose Gradient.
- In the Gradient Fill dialog box, open the Gradient Picker, then open the Preset Menu and choose Pastels. (**Photoshop:** In the Gradient Editor, open the Menu and choose Pastels. A window will open up, asking you if you want to replace the current gradients, click Append and then OK.
- Choose the Green, Blue, Yellow gradient and click OK. Set the Style to Linear, the Angle to 90 degrees and the Scale 100%. Check Align with layer and click OK.

Clip the Gradient to the Overlay

 In the Menu Bar, choose Layer > Create Clipping Mask to clip the Gradient Fill layer to the Diamond layer.

Add a Pattern to the Diamond Layer

- In the Layers panel, click on the Visibility icon of the Dots layer to reveal it,
- Double-click on the Dots Pattern Fill thumbnail, open the Pattern Picker and choose Gauze. If you don't see it open the Menu and choose Artist Surfaces. Click OK. (**Photoshop:** click on the Menu and choose Artist Surfaces and when the dialog box pops up click Append, then click OK.)

Change the Bland Mode

- In the Layers Panel, change the Blend Mode to Hard Light.
- Drag the Dots Pattern Fill layer below the Gradient Fill layer in the Layers panel. This should automatically clip it to the Diamond pattern but if not use a Clipping Mask to clip it. (In the Menu Bar, choose Layer > Create Clipping Mask)
- Activate the Gradient Fill layer, and change the Blend Mode to Lighten.

Edit Gradient Presets

- In the Layers panel, double-click on the Gradient Fill thumbnail. Open the Gradient Editor. Notice the little boxes under the color slider. These are called Color Stops.
- Click on one of the Color Stops to open the Color Change box. Click on the Color Change box to open the Color Picker and choose a new color.
- Follow the previous step for each Color Stop and then click OK to apply it to your document.
- Save your new Gradient by entering a name and then clicking the Add to Preset Button. It will now show up in your list of Gradient Presets. Click OK, and then OK again.

Save the Overlay

Save the Gradient Overlay (Save As) as a layered PSD in an easy to find location.
